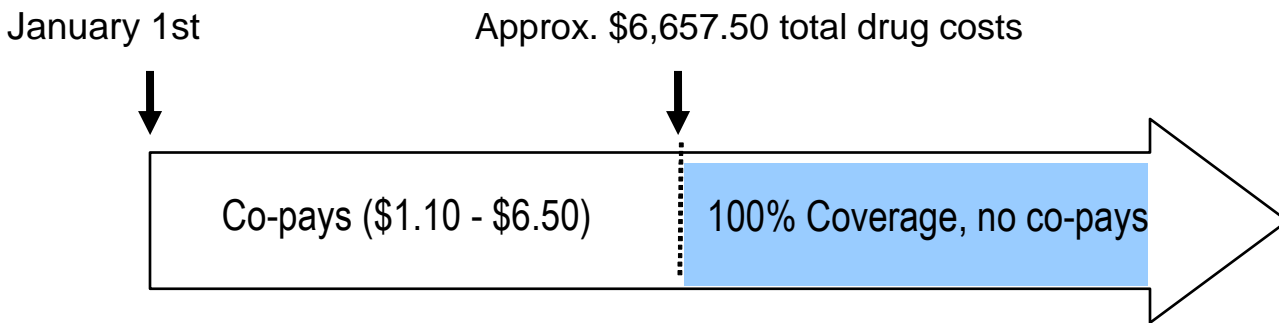


# 2012: Medicare Part D costs for a person with a full low income subsidy.

This includes individuals

- With both Medicare and Medicaid
- In a Medicare Savings Program\*
- With full extra help from Social Security\*\*



There is no coverage gap, donut hole, or initial coverage limit for any Part D enrollee with a full subsidy. If you choose a low cost plan, you will have no premium.

Co-pays vary depend on your income. You will pay either:

- \$1.10 for generics and \$3.30 for brand names if you have Medical Assistance AND your income is below 100% FPL
- \$2.60 for generics and \$6.50 for brand names if you have Medical Assistance AND income above 100% FPL
- \$2.60 for generics and \$6.50 for brand names if you have a Medicare Savings Program or extra help from Social Security.
- You will pay no co-pays (\$0) if you are in a nursing home or you are institutionalized or if you are receiving home and community based waiver services.

\* Medicare savings programs--QMB, SLMB, or SLMB+-- pay for some of your Medicare expenses. All of them pay for your Part B premiums. QMB pays for Medicare co-pays and deductibles. MSP asset = asset levels for extra help through Social Security.

The asset limits for full extra help through Social Security are (these are 2011 figures):

- \$6,680 for an individual and \$10,020 for a couple (these figures do not include an allowable \$1,500 burial allowance per person). These figures change every year usually in November.
