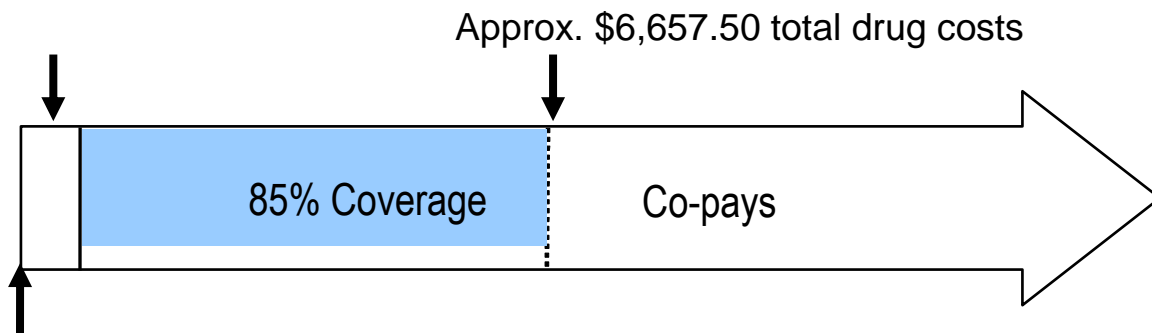


# 2012

## Medicare Part D costs for a person with a partial subsidy (“extra help”) from Social Security\*



There is no coverage gap, donut hole, or initial coverage limit for any Part D enrollee with Medicaid or a subsidy.

You will pay:

- Reduced monthly premiums on a sliding scale,
- a maximum of a \$65 deductible (if your plan has a deductible),
- 15% of the cost of your drugs until the total costs for your drugs - what you pay and what Medicare pays - reaches approx. \$6,557.50.
- Then you will pay about 5% of your drug costs or \$2.60-\$6.50 for each prescription.

\*For 2011, the asset limits for partial extra help through social security are: \$11,140 (not including an allowable \$1,500 set-aside for a burial allowance) for an individual and \$22,260 (not including an allowable \$1,500 per person set-aside for a burial allowance) for a couple). These figures usually change in November of each year. The current numbers are in effect until they are replaced with new number.
