A Case-focused *Educational* Service; Not Clinical Case-Consultation

The intent of this service is to provide continuing education to healthcare, juvenile justice, and education professionals that serve Wisconsin's children and adolescents. The service is provided to assist in improving the professional competencies of these professionals. Challenging cases are particularly welcomed, as well as those where a variety of professionals are involved. "Real life" clinical cases are used to provide a focused, relevant incentive to participation. However, no personally identifiable client information will be gathered and utilized in the provision of this program.
