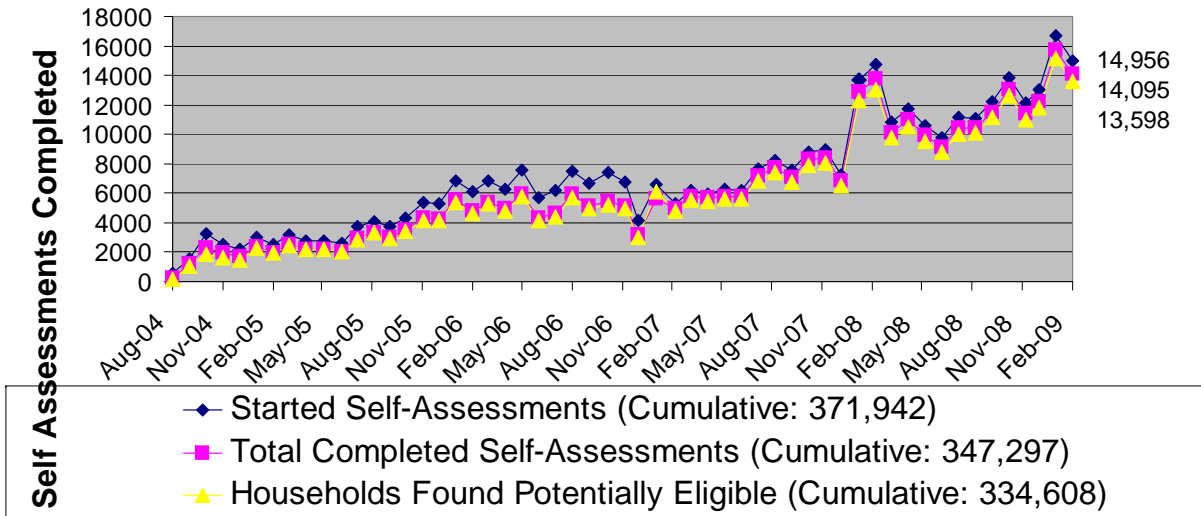

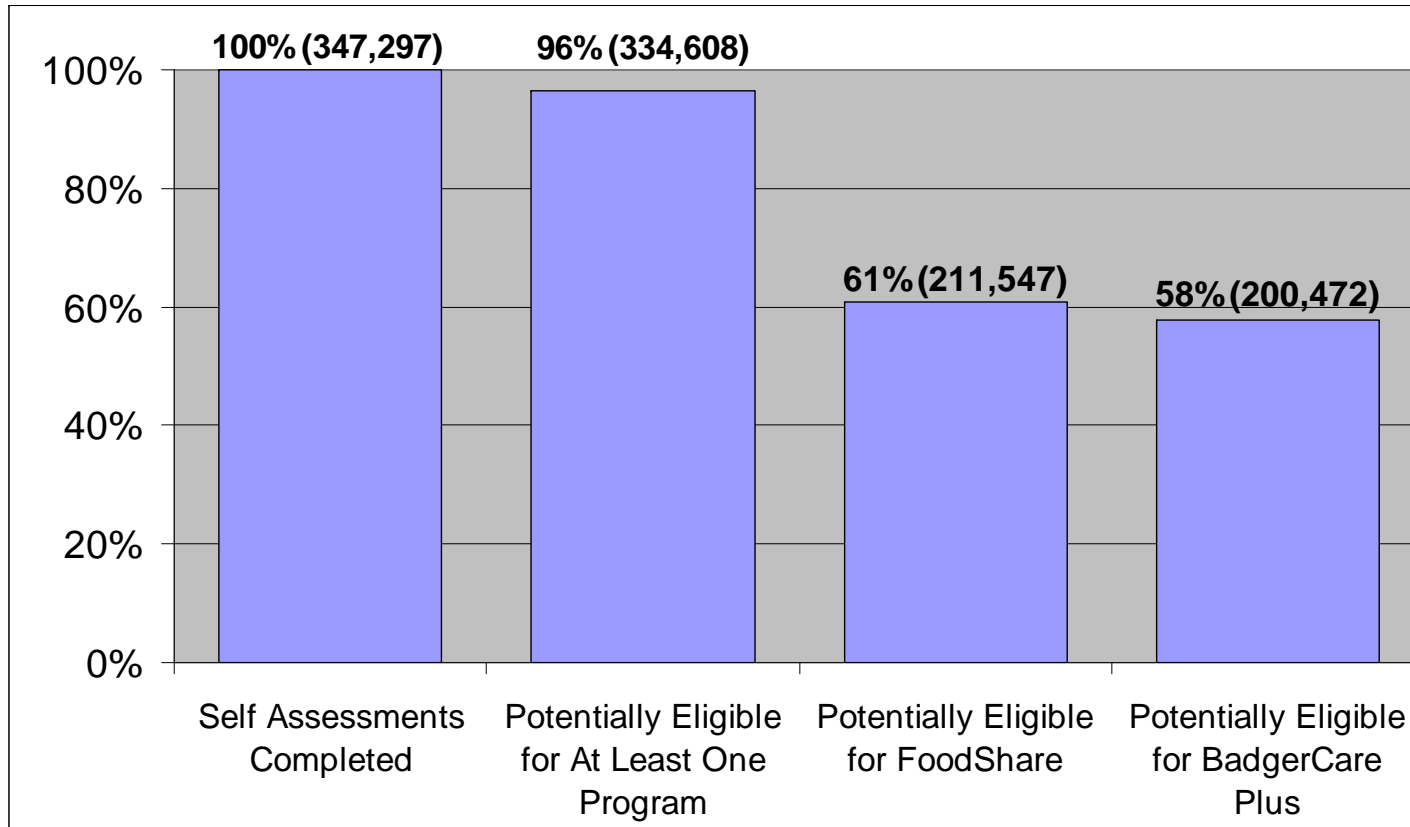

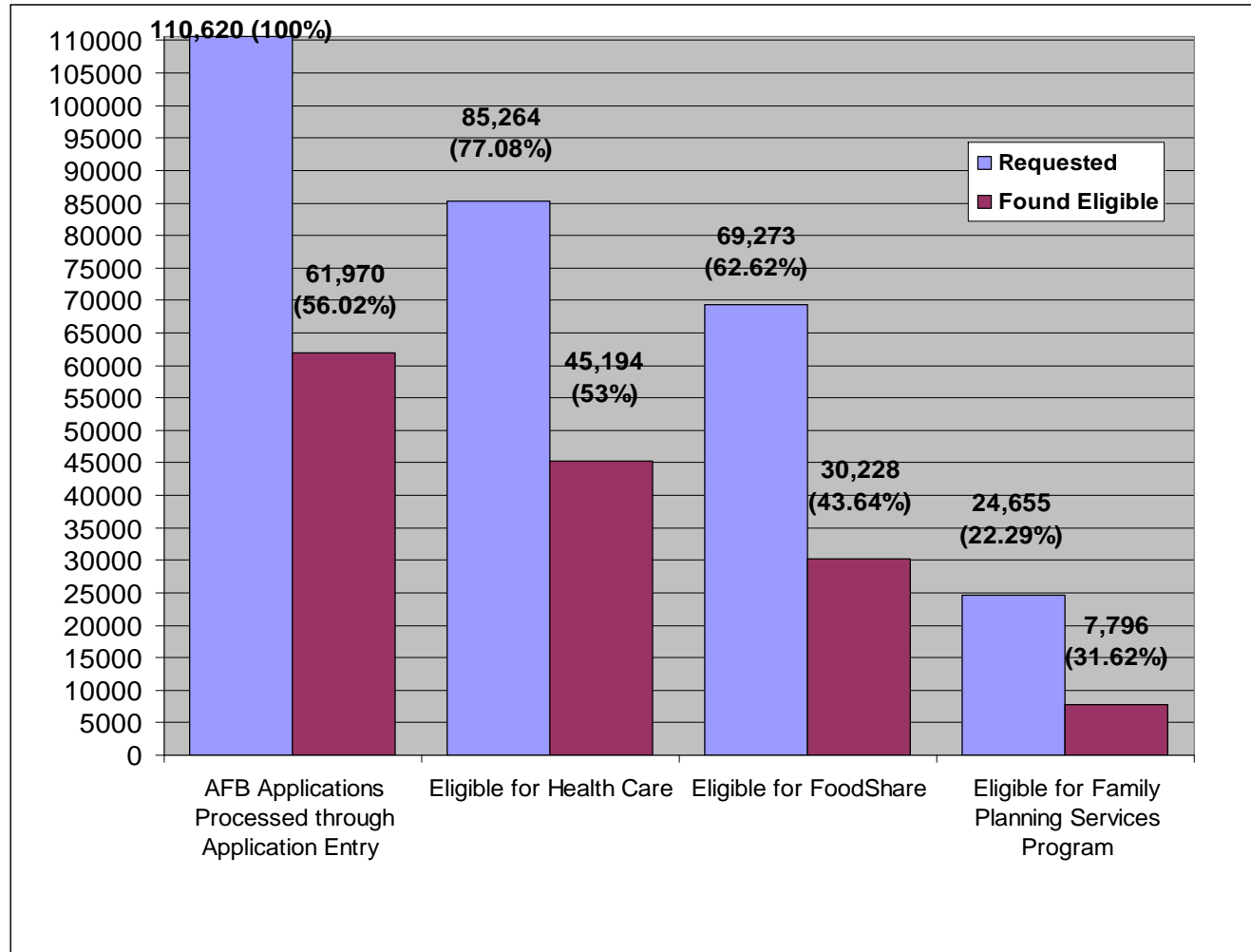

**Eligibility Results of the Applications Submitted from ACCESS**

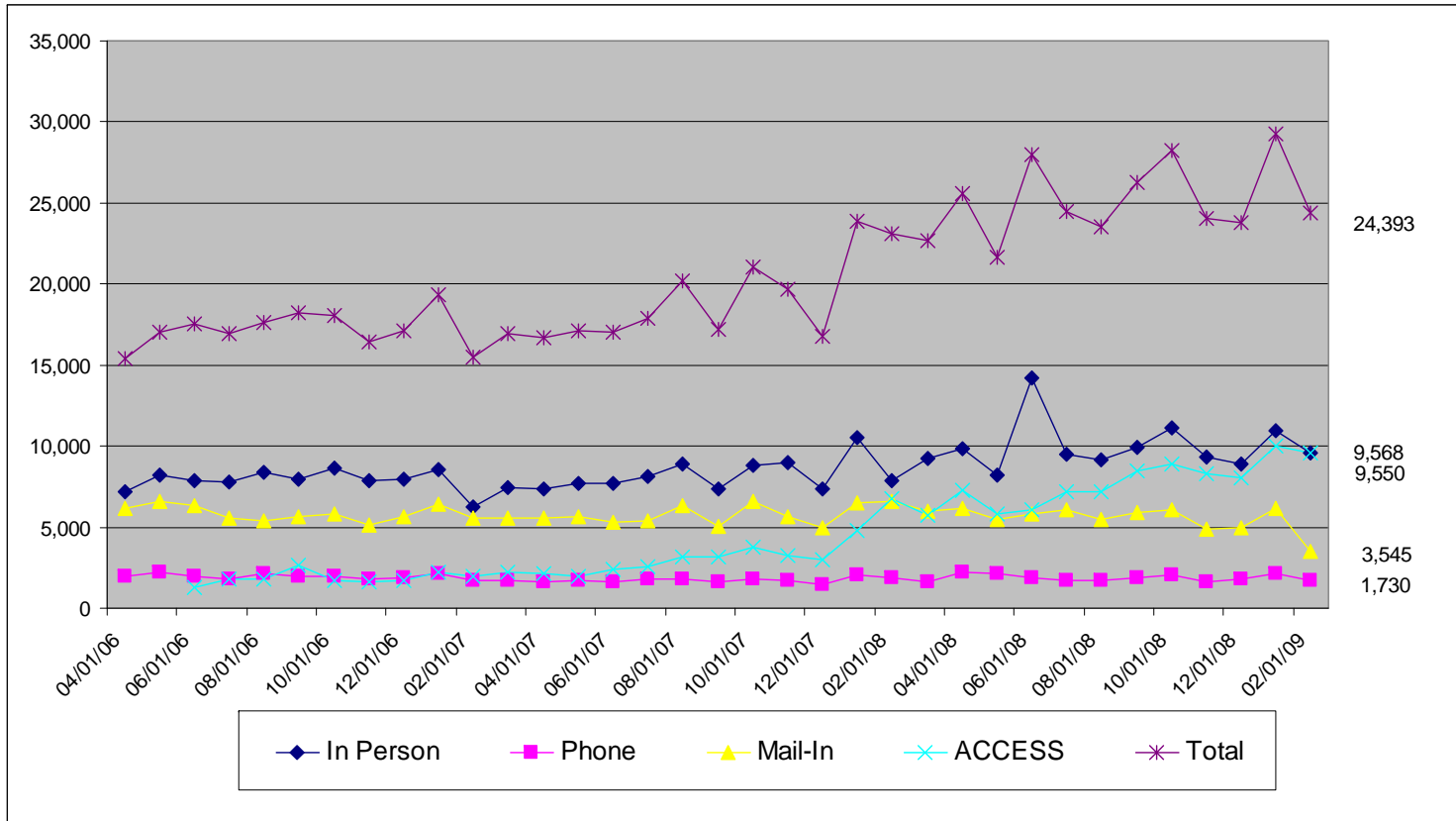

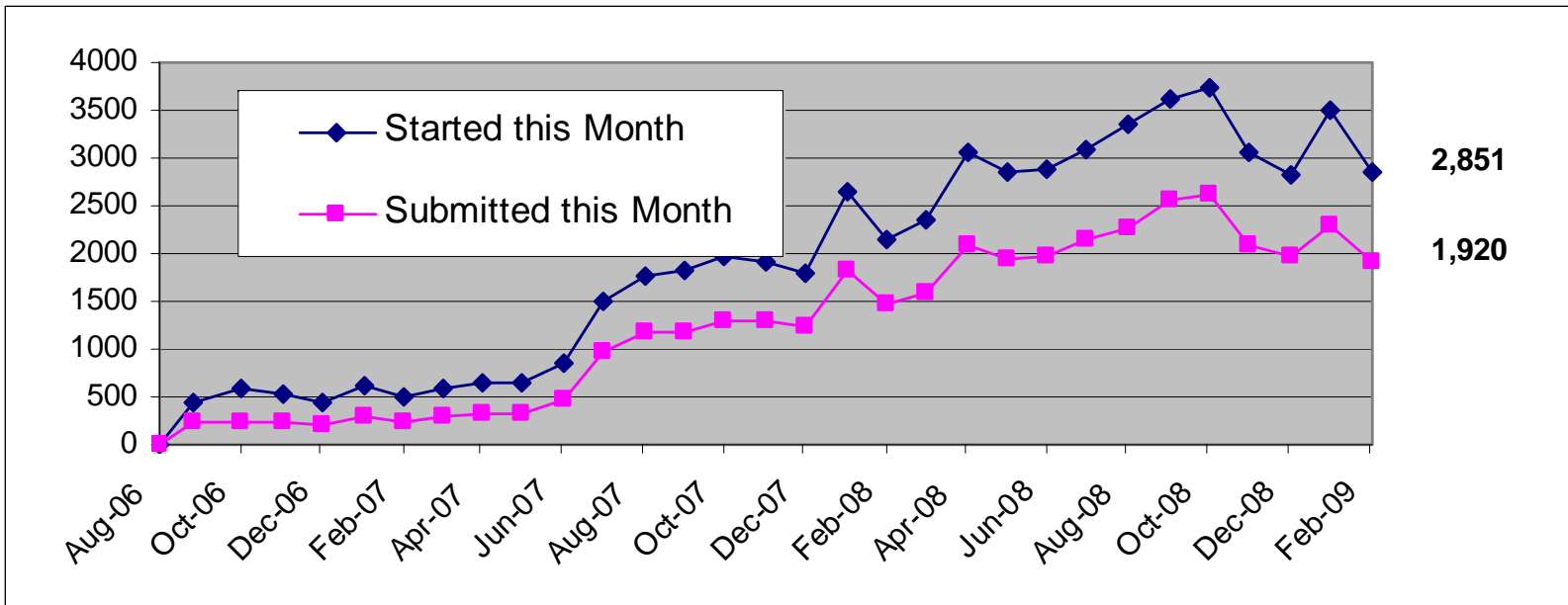
