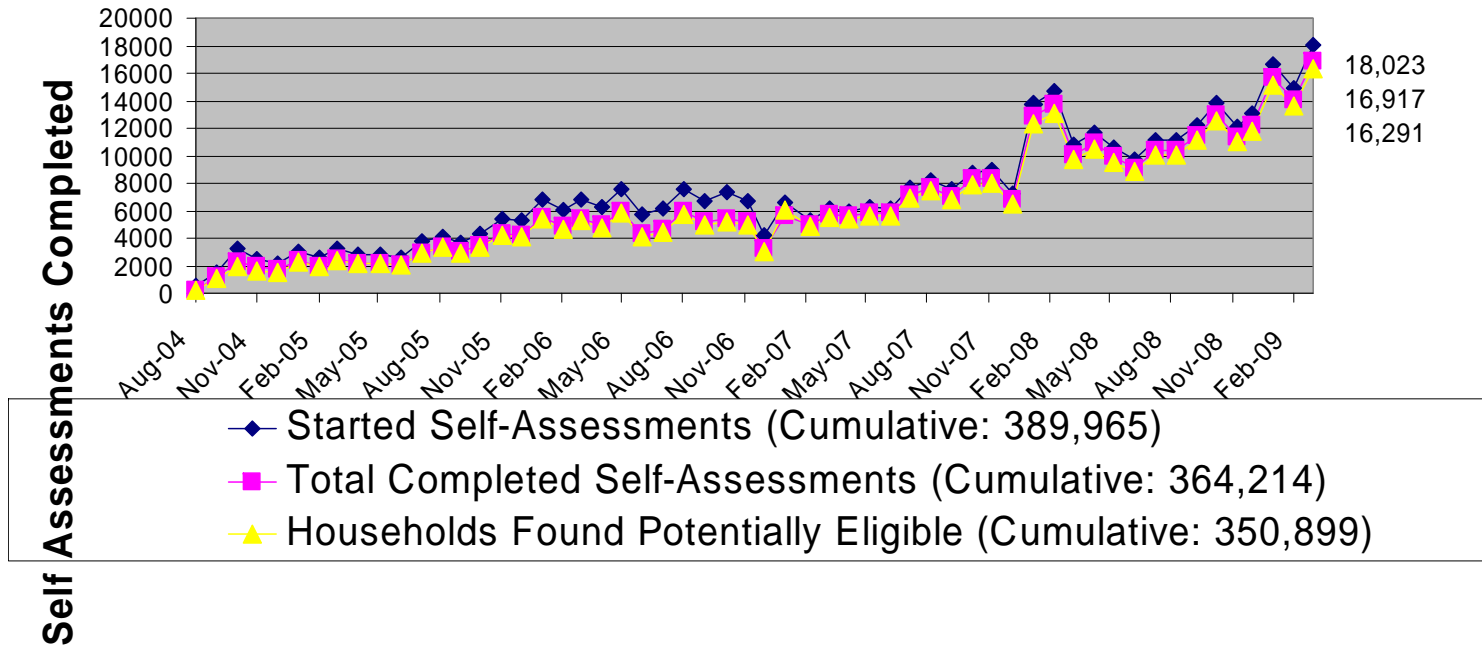

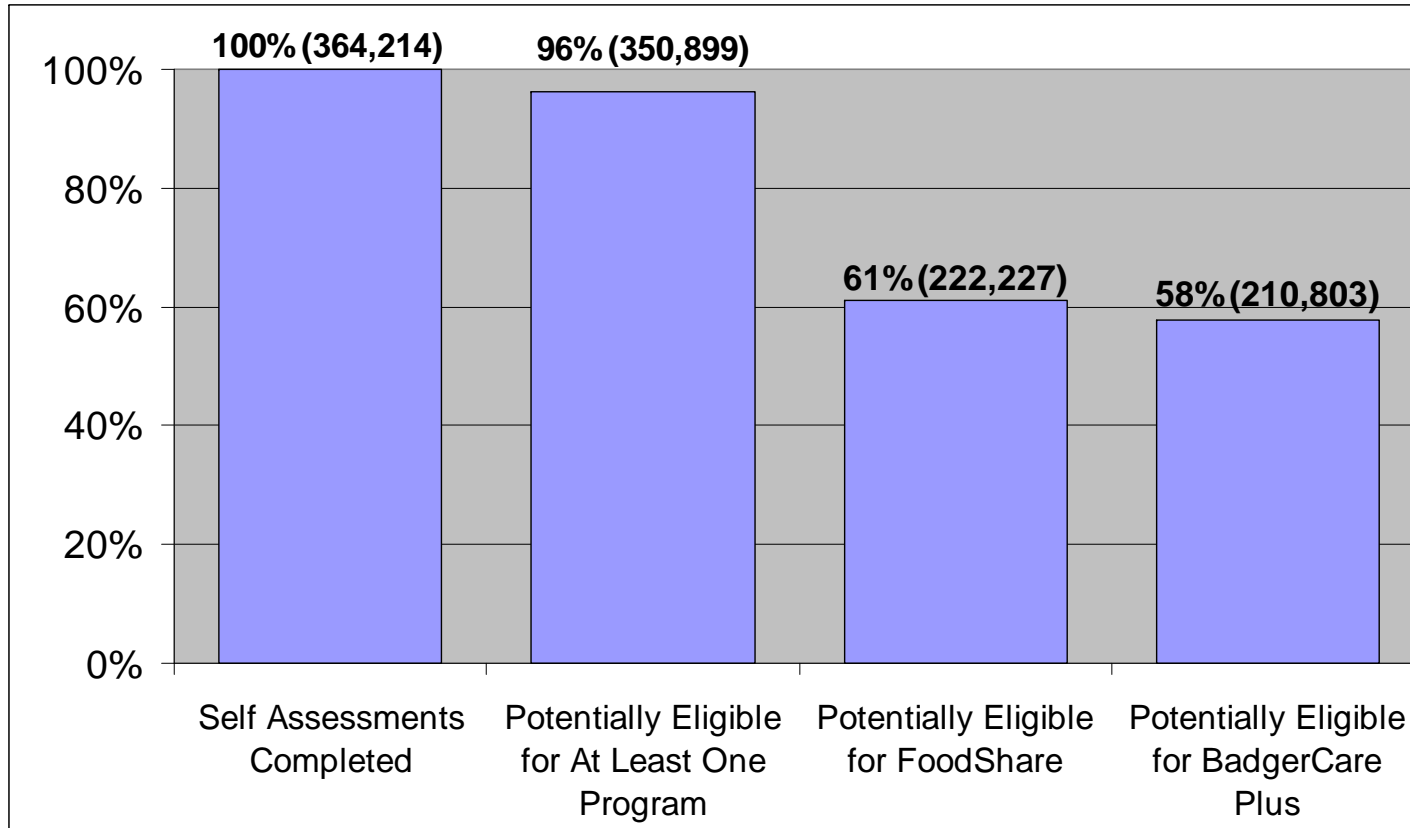

In January of this year, (2009, I applied again when I went in for my annual Food Share evaluation. I received a letter from the "Robles Center" denying my application again. I don't know what this "Robles Center" is since I went to the Marcia Coggs Center on 12th & Vliet Street, here in Milwaukee. This "Robles Center" also had assigned me a different case number than the one that I have for the Food Share program. It is terribly inefficient to assign a different case for every program application for each client

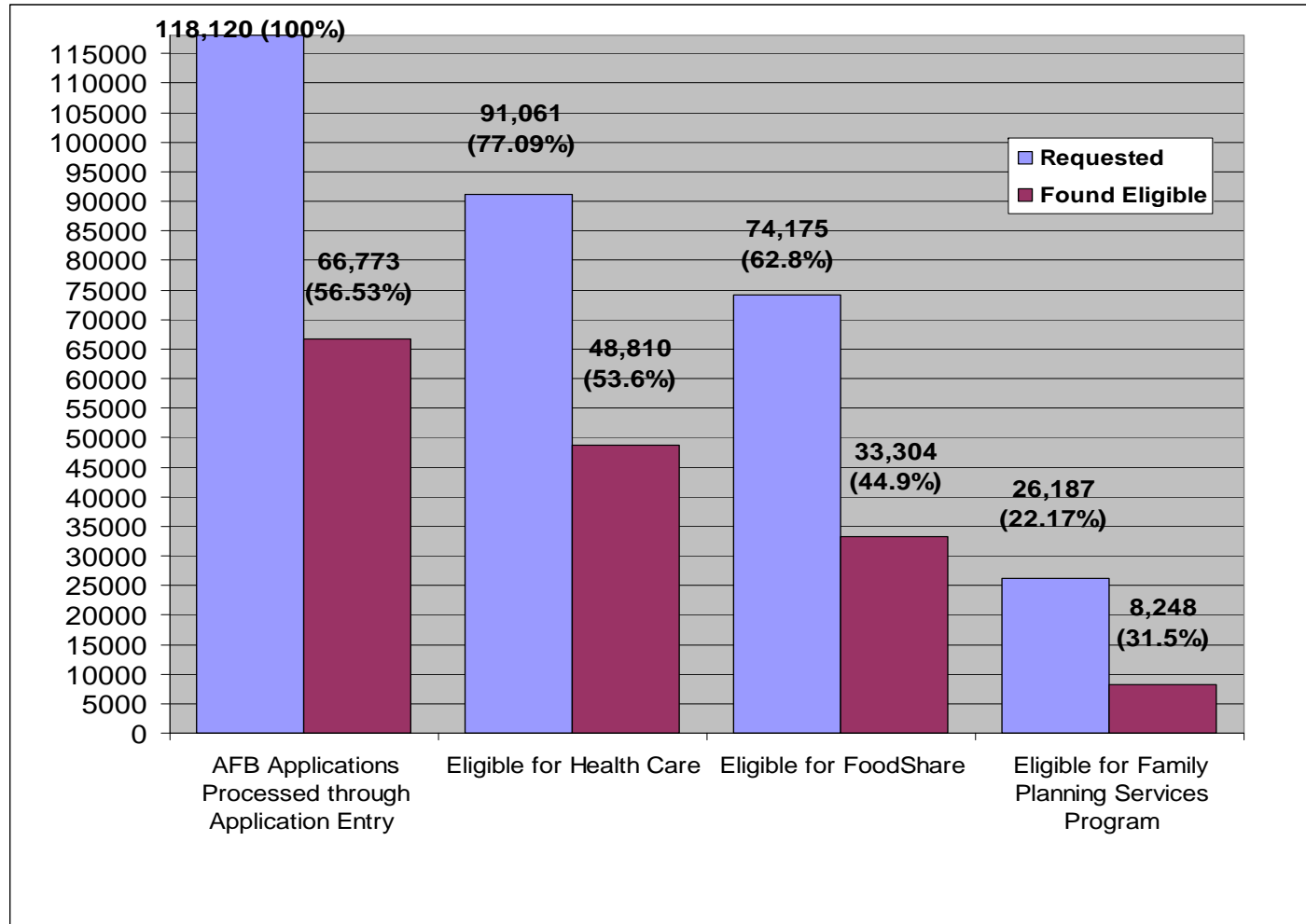

**Eligibility Results of the Applications Submitted from ACCESS**

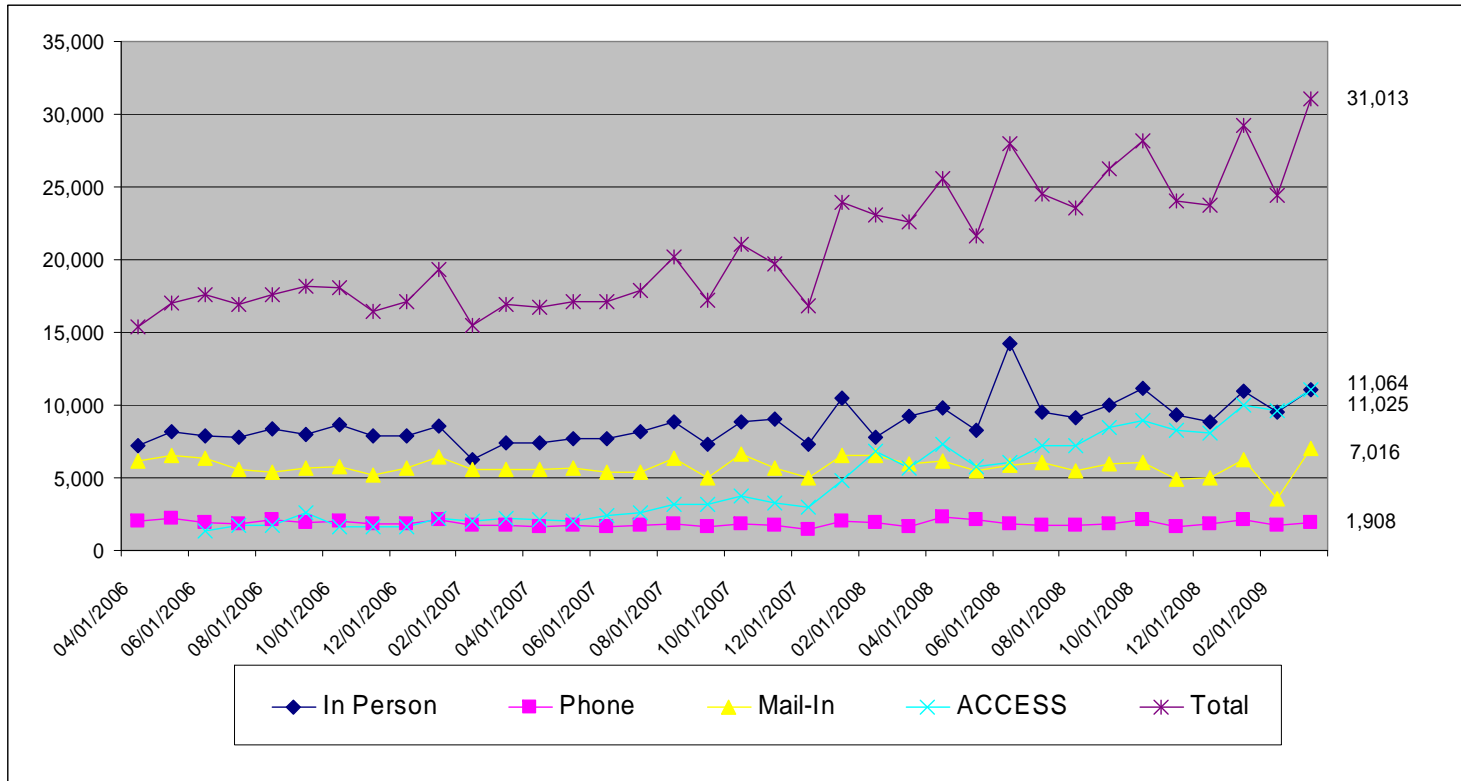

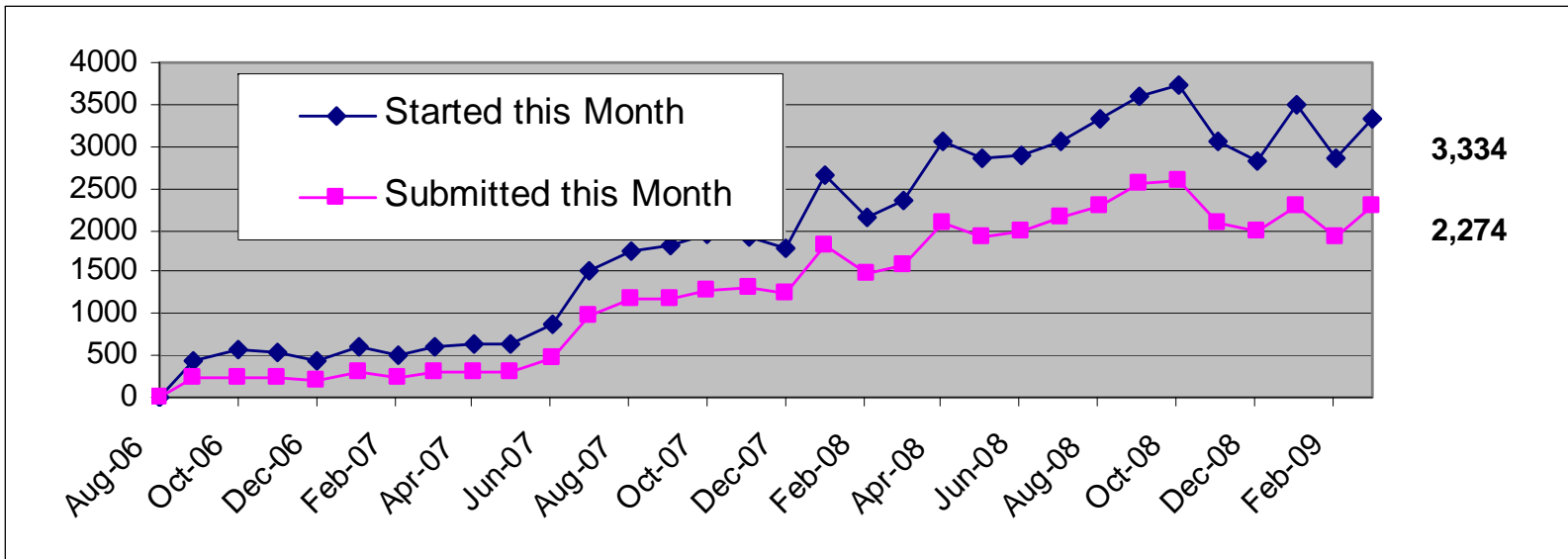
