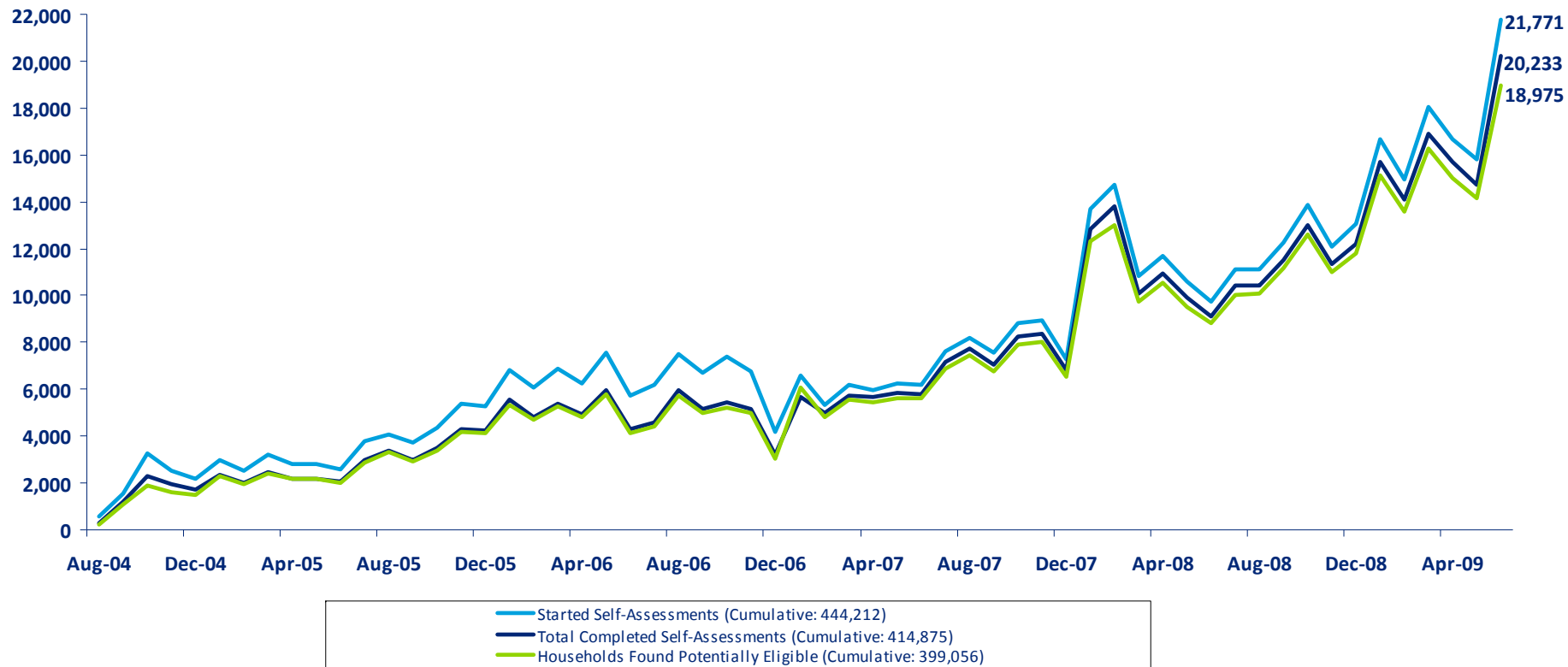

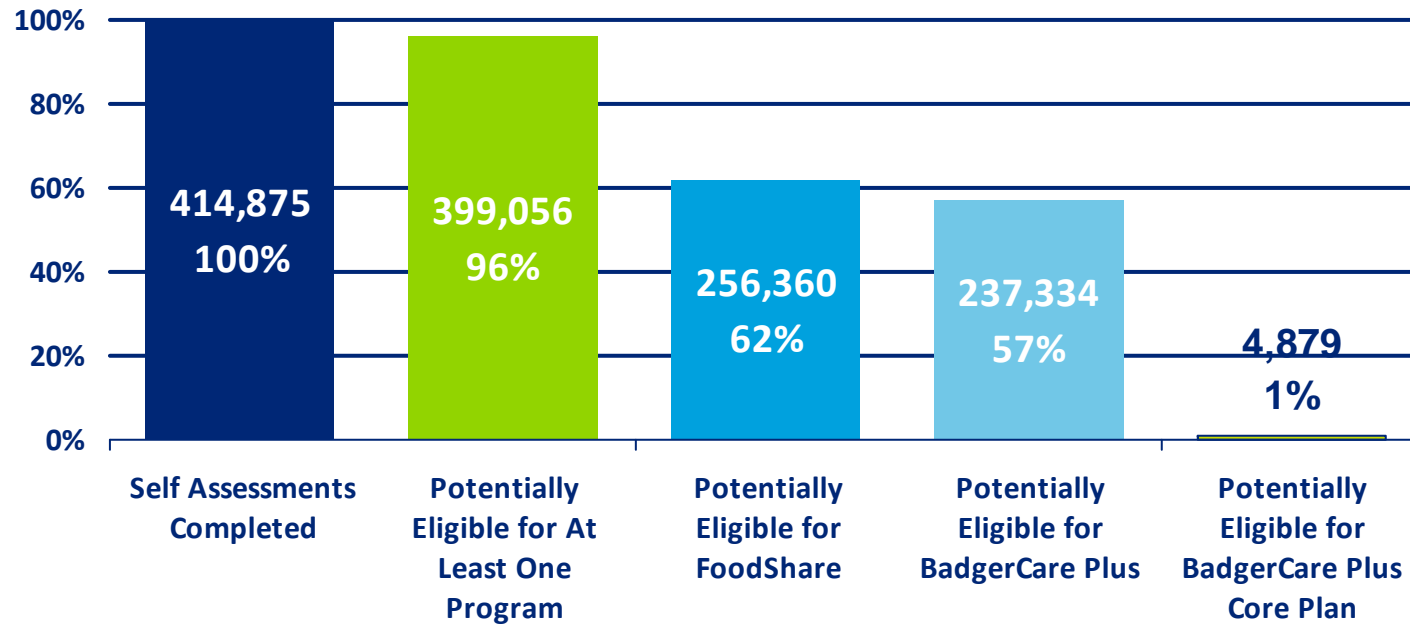

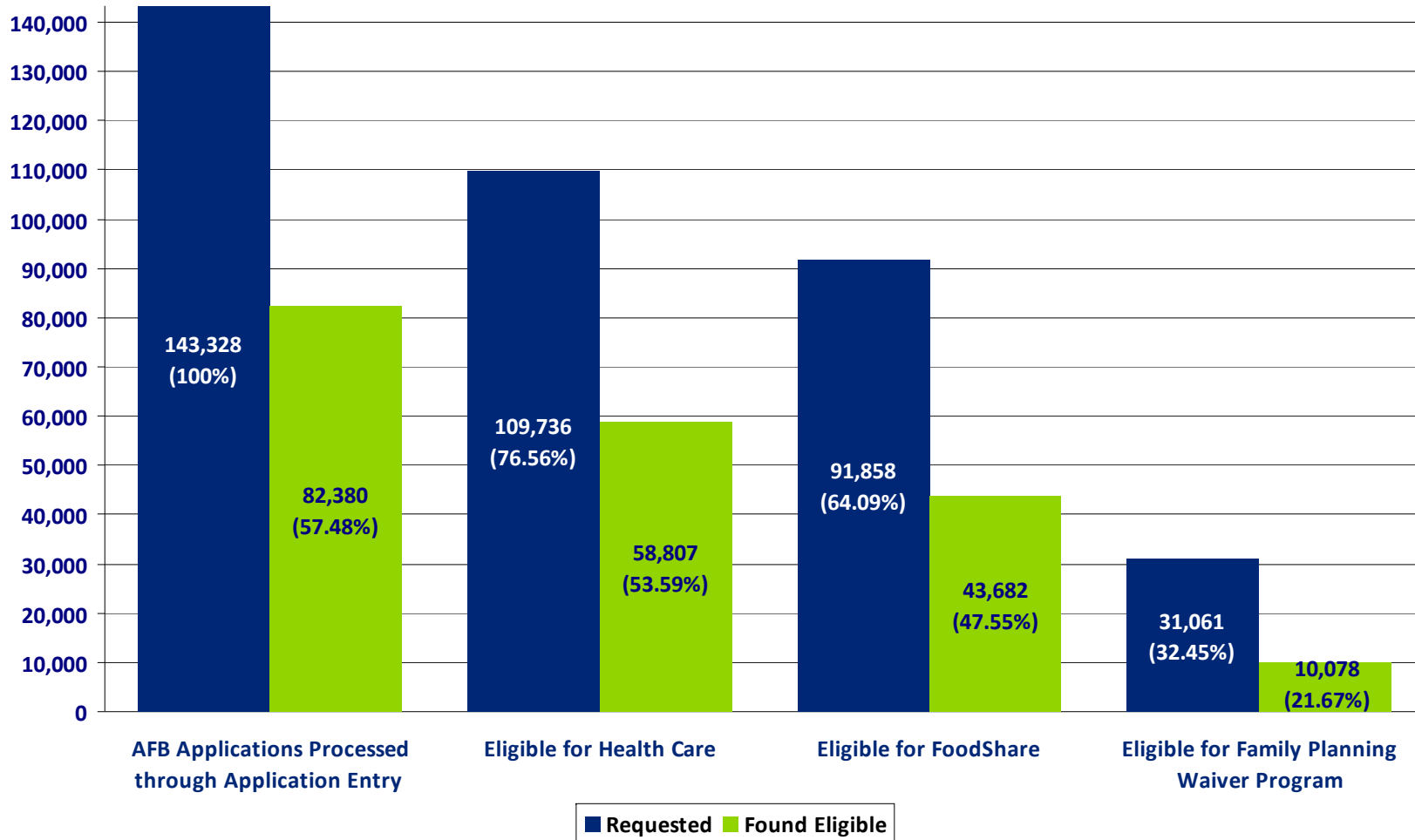

## Eligibility Results of the Applications Submitted from ACCESS



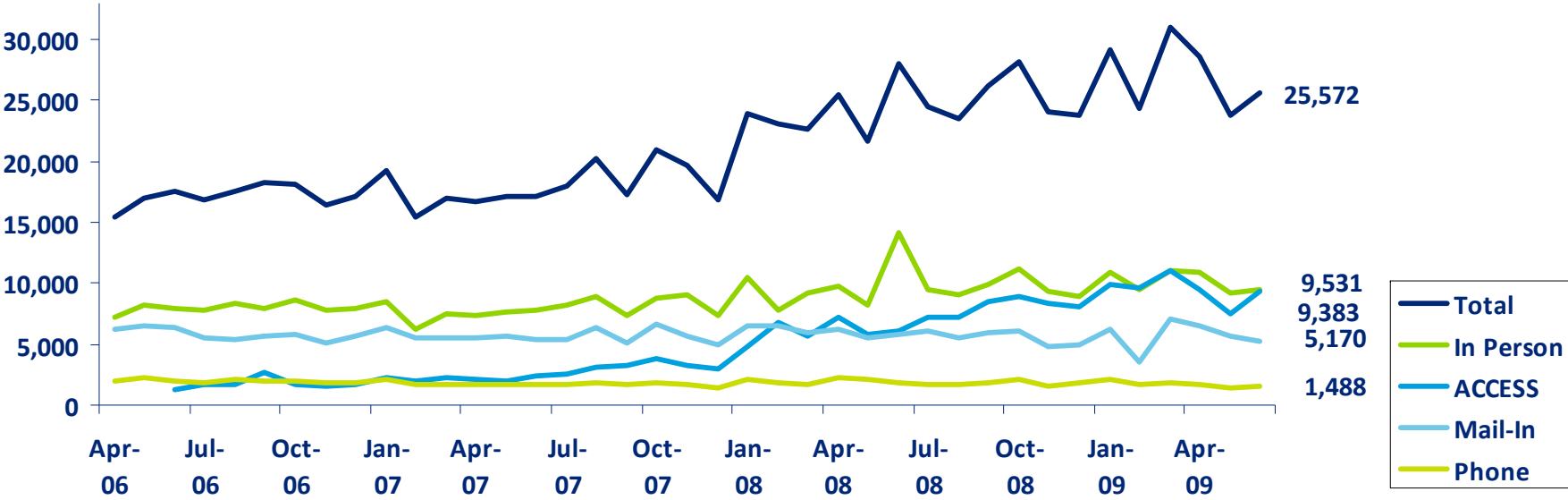

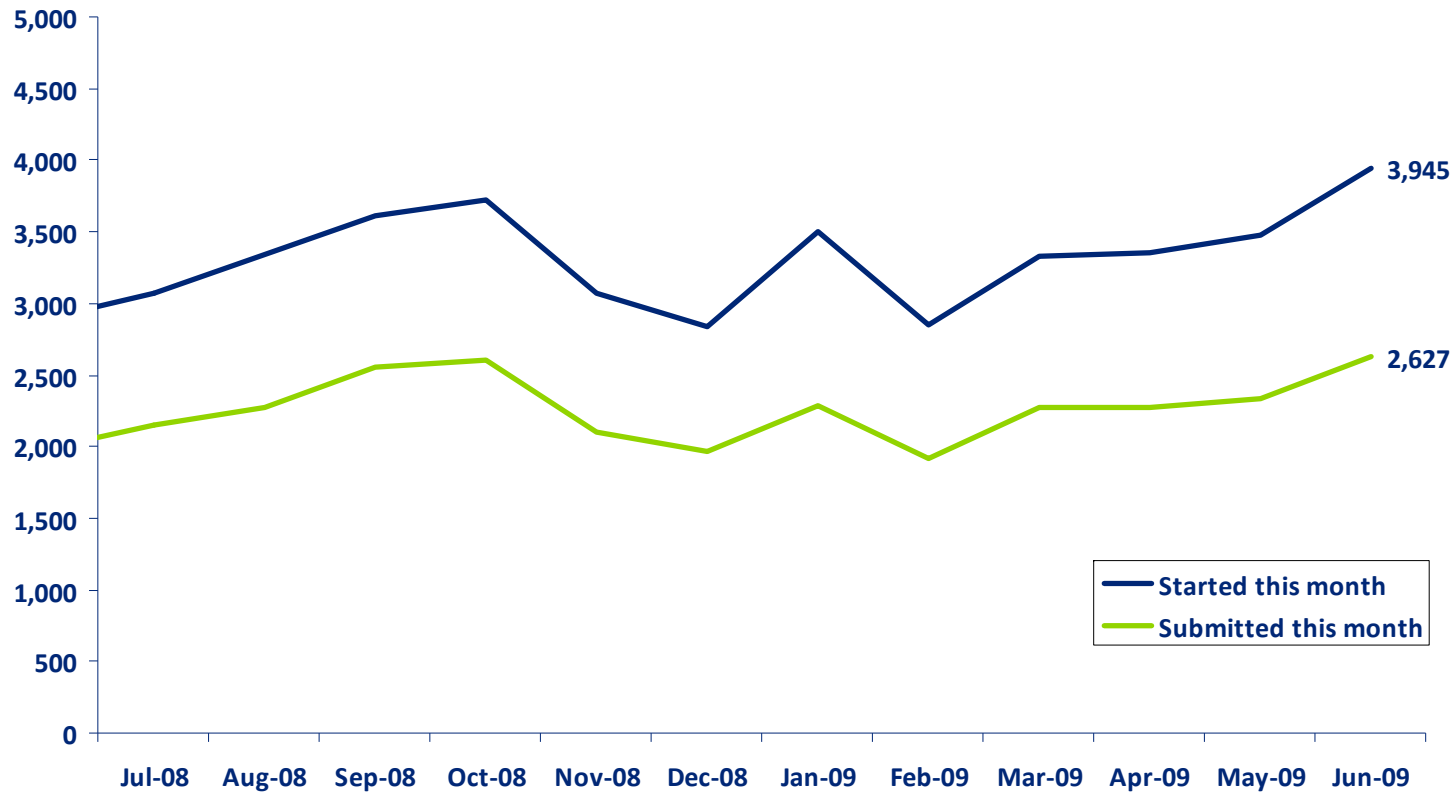
