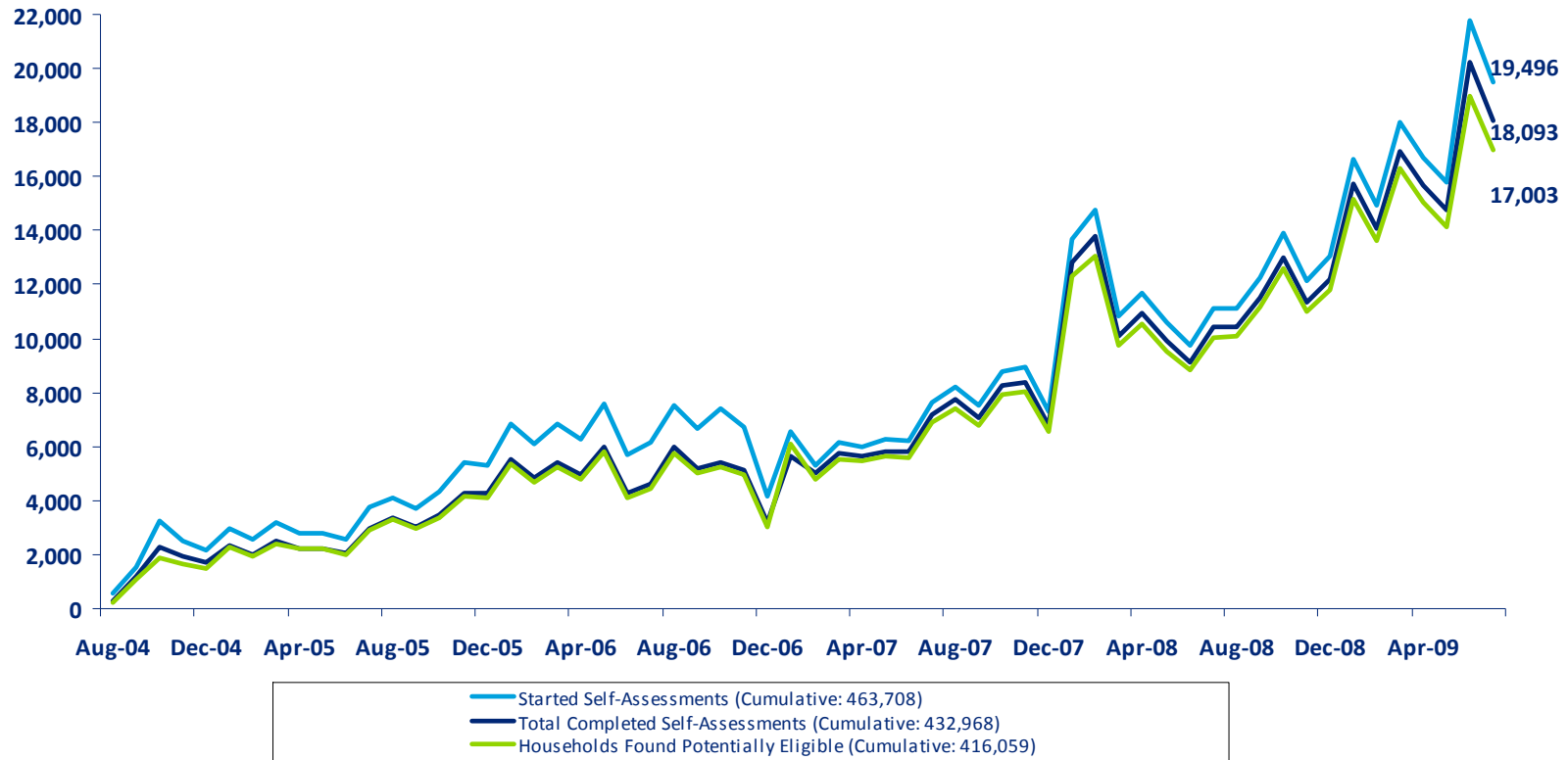

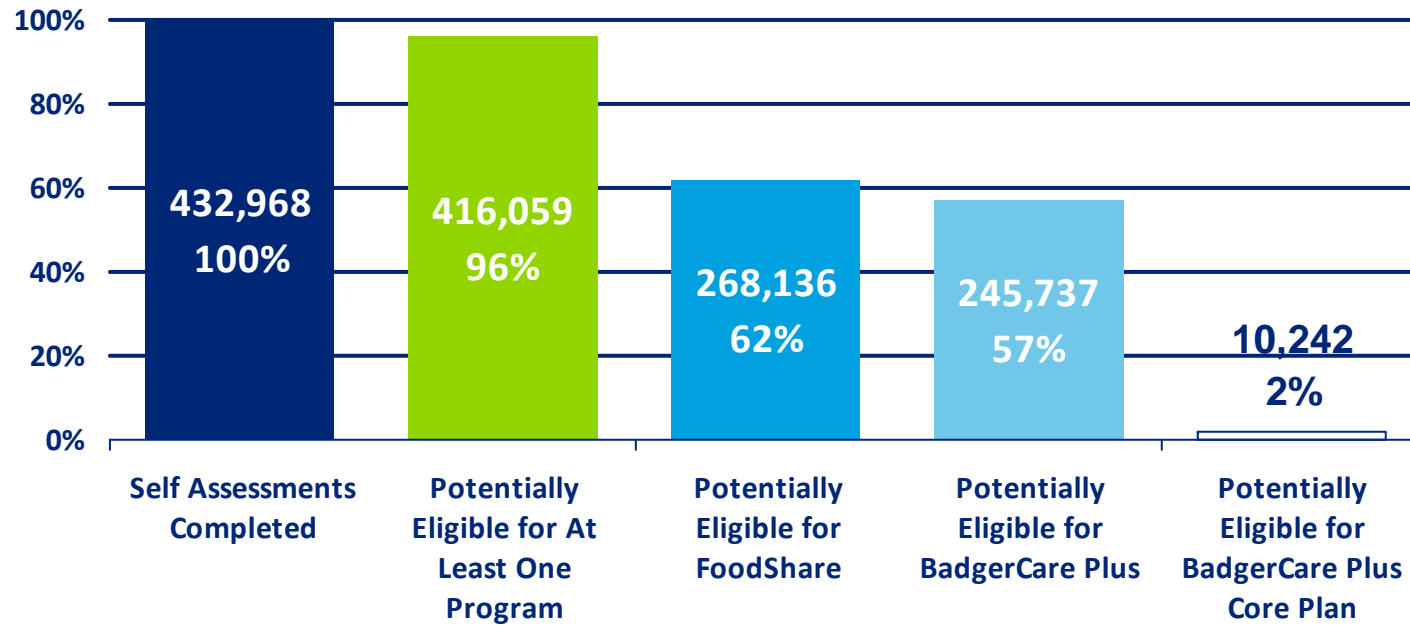

I am not for sure who i would ask, but here is my situation: My husband and i recently got married, a week before our wedding he was fired. i work about 40-45 hours a week. currently hen is working at a temp agency getting almost 30-35 hours. he has chorines disease and needs insurance. my work has insurance but they consider his disease a pre-existing disease and will not cover his infusions, which are 7,000 dollars. i start school in august, we do not get financial aid this semester so i have to pay out of pocket. i will not be able to work full time. since my husband is only working through a temp agency we do not know how long it will last for. we have never been on public aid before, is their any way we an get assistance?

The form indicates that if I have insurance, I'm not eligible. This is not my understanding of the letter sent to me by HIRSP. Thank you.

- When I get 31% of the way on the online application, where it asks "Who to enroll in family planning" it then goes to a blank page with a tracking number & says my session has ended due to an error. I have logged out, re-logged in, and even created a new account twice. It is very annoying and I have not had the chance to complete & submit my application.
- I received a letter from HIRSP advising me to apply for BadgerCare Plus Core Plan. However, when I took your questionnaire online it said I probably would not be eligible to apply because I already had Health Insurance. This would seem to be in total contradiction from the letter I received from HIRSP. I appear to meet the eligibility requirements they state in their letter so I am confused why the questionnaire said I would be denied.

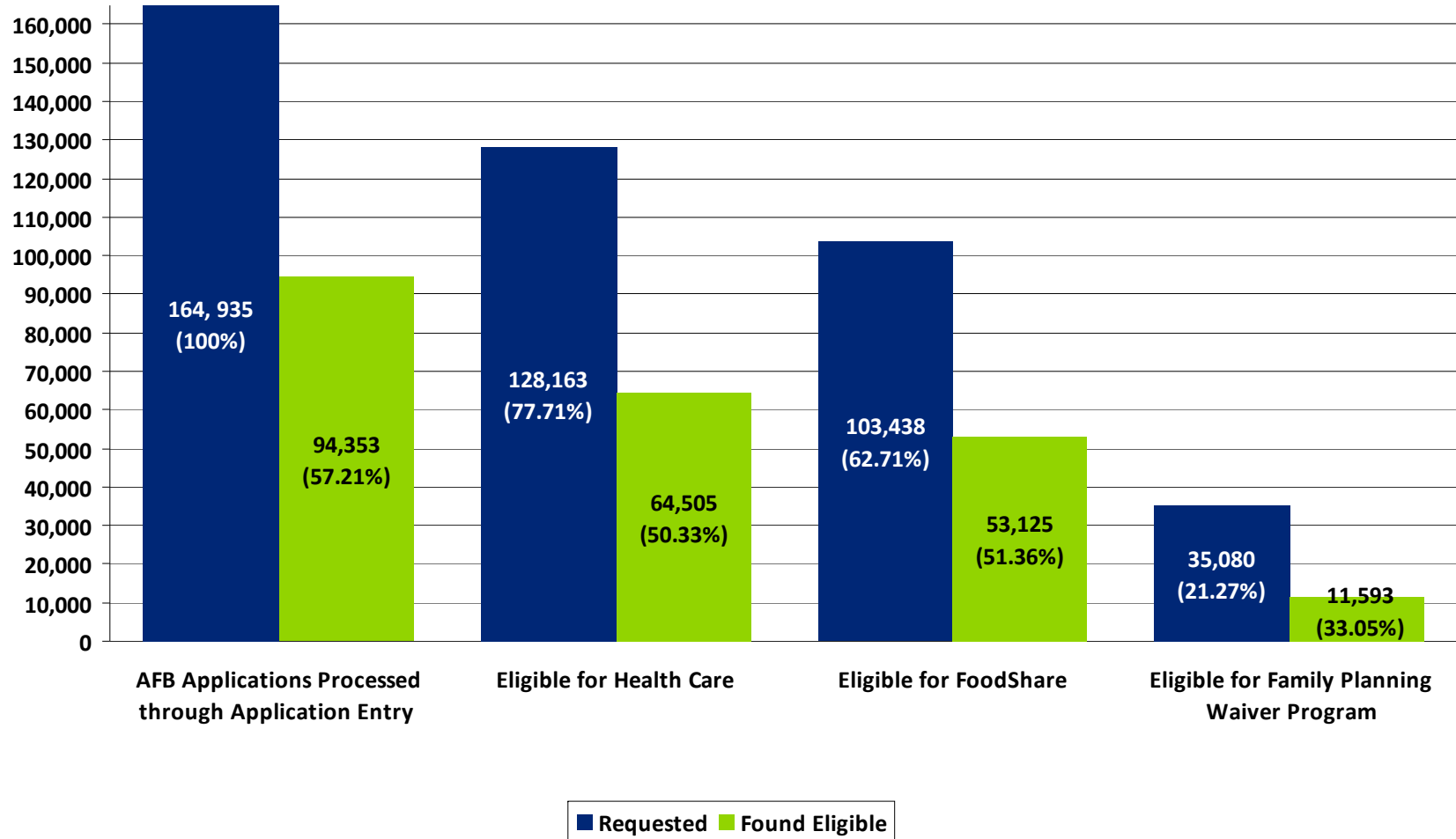

Eligibility Results of the Applications Submitted from ACCESS



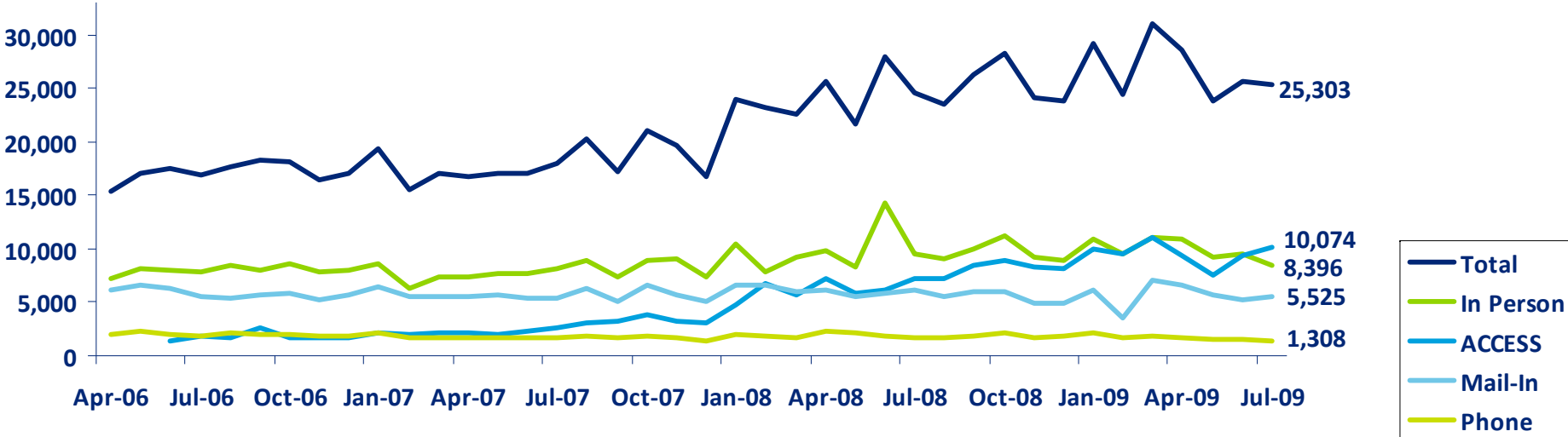

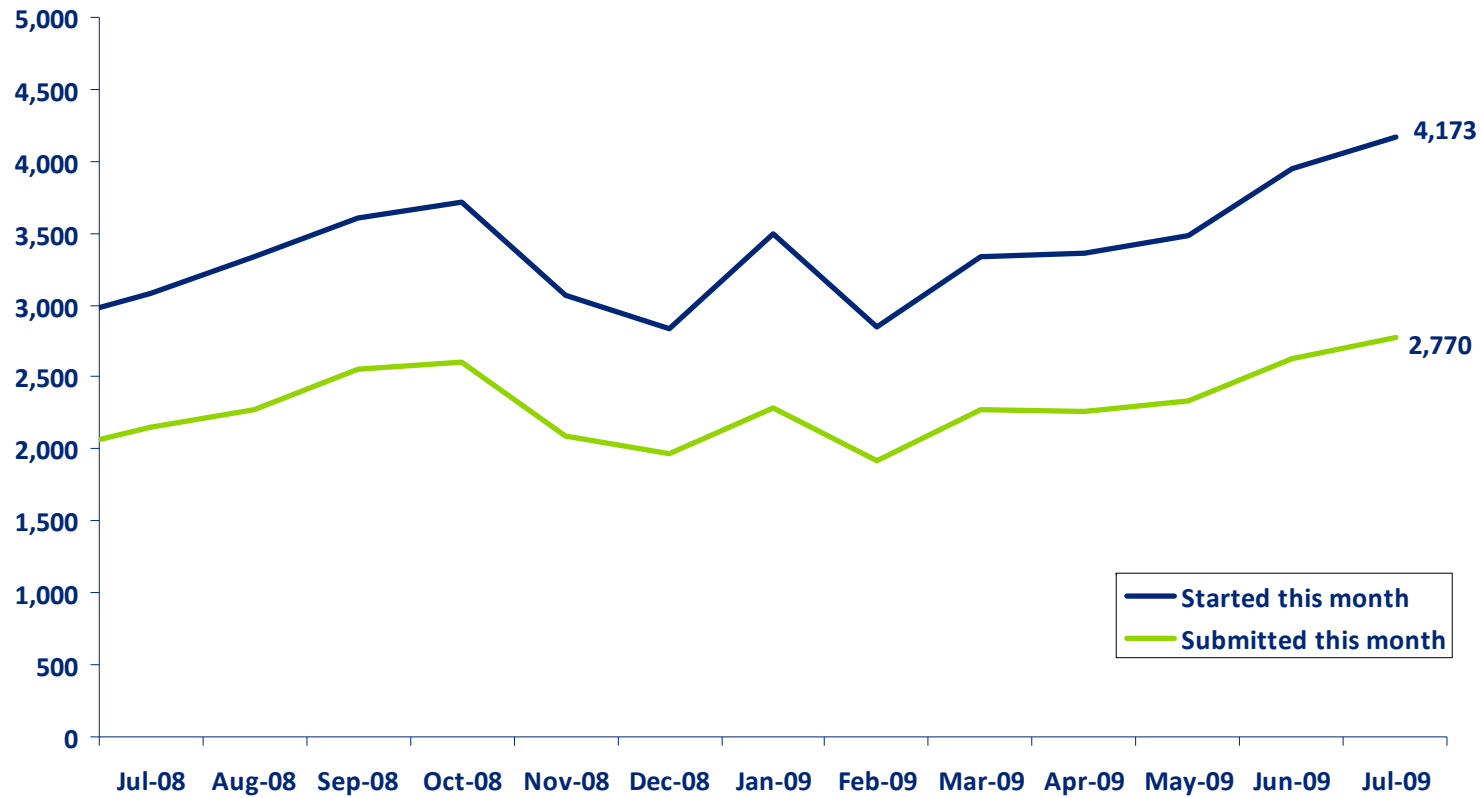
