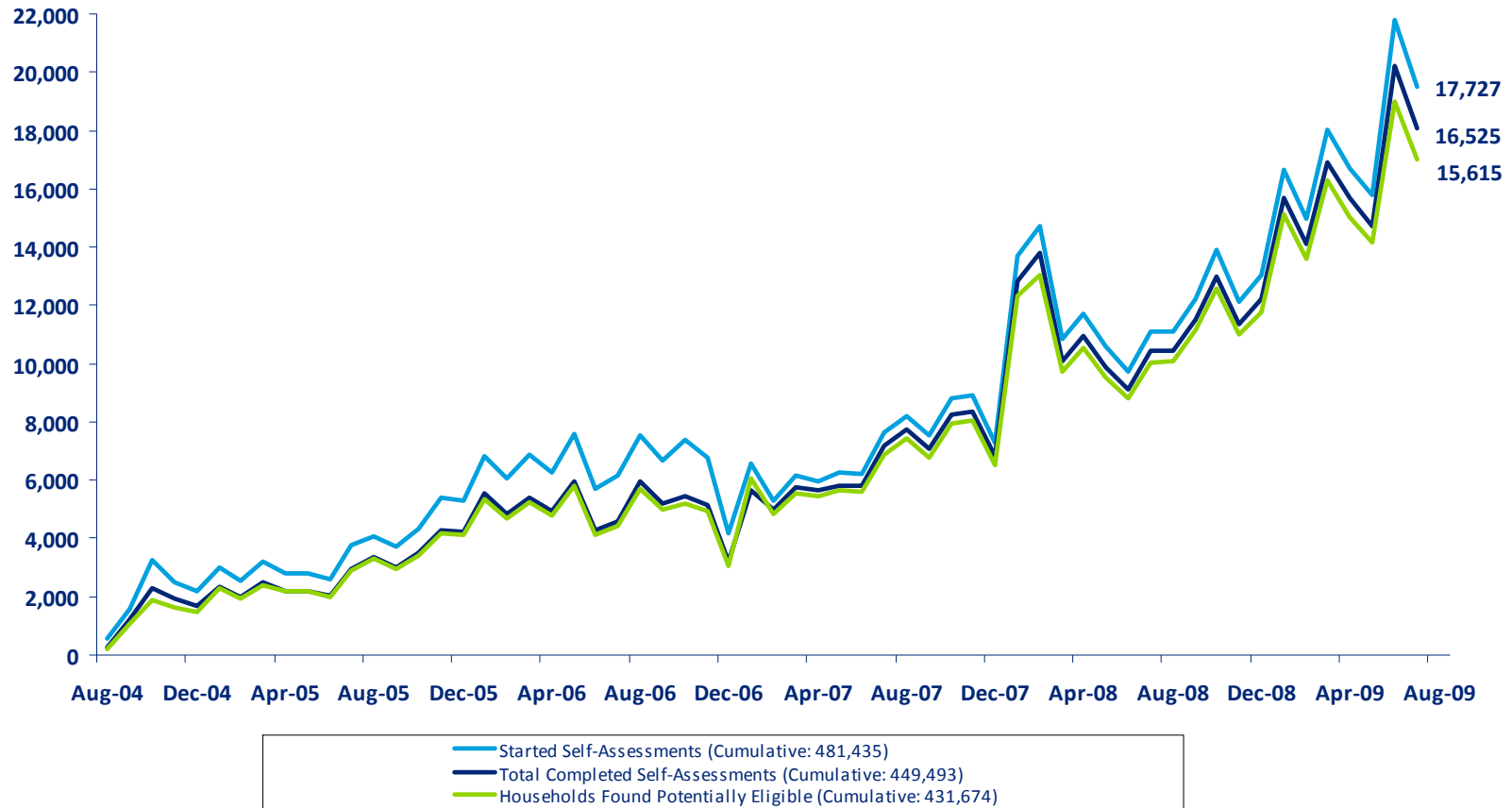

AIE Self Assessment Statistics

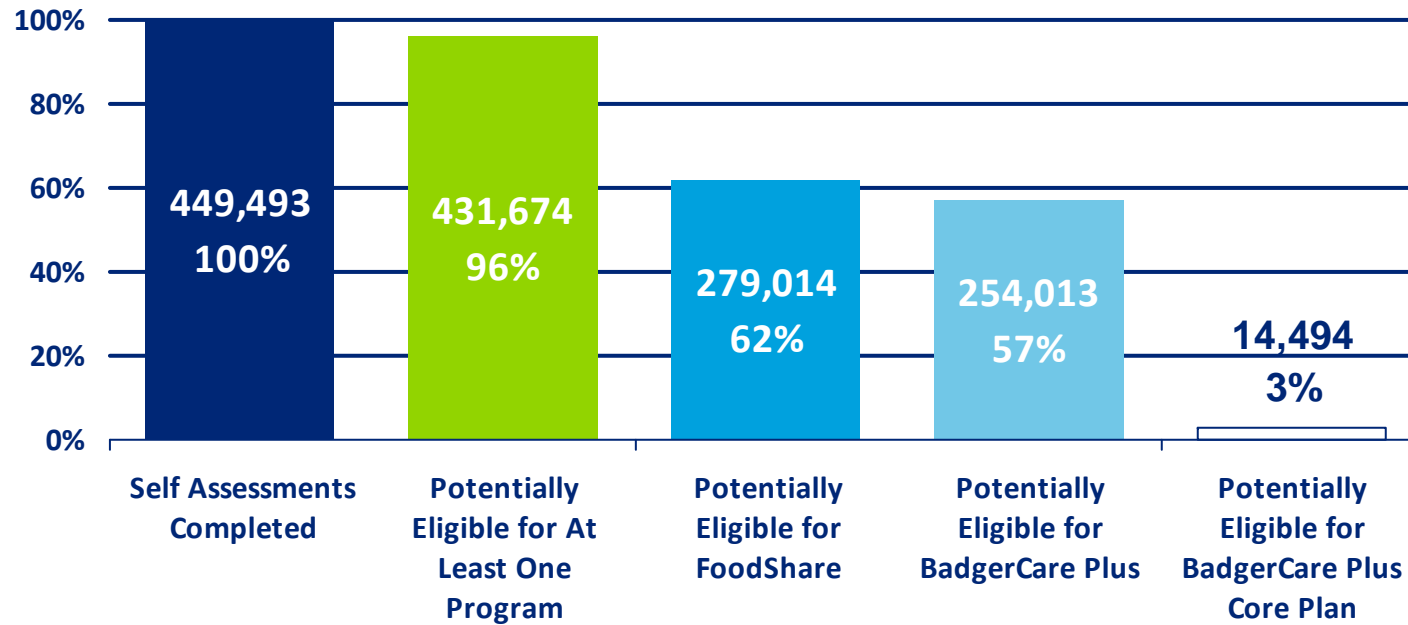


Average self assessments started per month: **19,665**

- This site was extremely helpful, i am self employed and health insurance is taking 3/4ths of my income. i am getting deeper and deeper in the hole every month and did not know of any way to change it. i found out i am eligible for free health care and that would make it possible to actually buy groceries once in a while.
- I think that people should report on your form NET AND NOT GROSS FROM YOUR PAY CHECK. After paying utilities and food and rent does not leave with much money after each paycheck. Remember not only are taxes taken out of ones check, but also 401K, Dental, Vision, FSA. This should not count on the question form.
- When asking about income from Social Security, is it before medicare and student loan off set or after? Also, when it comes to dental expenses, I need to see a dentist but can not afford to so what amount would I put in?
- hello i just want to said thanks.but i want to makre sure if my application is feeling right,how can i know that,other wise you are so nice people.thanks for your help. and i hope you can understand my apllication,thakyou.
- My name is Jeffery and i applied for badger care + on 6-18-09 and recieved a tracking number of xxxxxxxxxx yet i have gotten no responce or info about the outcome, the phone service is a joke and the access wis .gov. web site is worthless. I have become homeless , you may call xxx-xxx-xxxx or e-mail at xxxx@yahoo.com. this is info you allready have. or did i get ripped off of \$60.00
- I have had to apply for Soc. Sec. benfits due to the loss of 50% of my income since 12/08 caused by the economy's downturn. It seems cruel to use the only retirement income I have coming against my being eligible. I have worked my entire adult life for non-profits or as an independant contractor and never had health coverage nor pension benefits. Except for a partime job I've held for the past few years I've not had unemployment rights either. The application also fails to consider the credit card debt I've run up over the past ten years to cover medical expenses and the fact that monthly debt service payments exceed my mortgage payment. Also, I have only been recieving Soc. Sec. since July '09 and unemployment since June '09, so my monthly income has only been so large for ONE month and I'm shut out. In addition, if I make a few dollars more in a particular week, my unemployment is severly curtailed. And if I work harder and longer, my ENTIRE Soc. Sec. check becomes threatened.
- This application fails to take into consideration the fact that I don't have monthly medical expenses because I CAN'T AFFORD THEM! I haven't had an eye exam or new galsses for 3 or 4 yrs. - I forget exactly - and I need them! I haven't seen a doctor for years except for two emergency room visits which nearly bankrupted me. I'm 62 y/o and haven't had a prostate exam in over 5 yrs. My teeth are literally falling out of my head - I'm currently missing TEN although the the roots of two remain after the caps fell out and I can't afford to have them removed leaving me terrified of a serious infection developing. Why can't an estimate of those necessary medical expenses be considered? I am glad my taxes are helping the destitute, but why do we tax-paying working poor get excluded?
- The website should list all the information needed to fill out prior to using. The forms were fairly easy to use.
- What is the use of entering all this information, when all you tell us is that we are not eligible for any of the programs.

- When figuring our results you did not figure in that on average we spend \$200.00 per mo. on heat and light. Also \$415.82 per mo. on a car payment. This kind of exspence should be counted. if it was we would probably qualifie for more programs. Thank you for reading my comment.
