**MENOMINEE COUNTY HEALTH & HUMAN SERVICES – HEALTH DIVISION PASSES
REVIEW BY STATE HEALTH OFFICIALS**

MADISON—Dr. Seth Foldy, State Health Officer, today announced that the Menominee County Health & Human Services – Health Division has successfully passed the state’s health department review. As a result, the Menominee County Health Division will maintain its Level I status.

“The hard-working staff of the Menominee County Health Division help make their community a healthier and safer place to live,” said Foldy. “Their department has an actively engaged and supportive Board of Health, and does an excellent job of providing a number of quality public health services to the community.

The Wisconsin Department of Health Services is required to formally review the operations of all 92 Wisconsin local health departments at the county or municipality level at least every five years. The review establishes the health department as a level I, II or III agency. A level I agency meets the minimum requirements and a level III agency meets the maximum requirements established for a local health department.

The Menominee County Health Division provides services important to the community, such as:

- Lead Education and Prevention program
- Public Health Preparedness
- Injury Prevention
