**Notes on this resource:**

- **IRIS participants** access all Medicaid LTC State Plan services listed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> column and all acute/primary services with their Medicaid card.
- **Family Care members** access Medicaid LTC State Plan services listed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> column through the Family Care program. They access all acute/primary services with their Medicaid card.
- **Family Care Partnership members** access Medicaid LTC State Plan and **most** acute/primary Medicaid services through the Family Care Partnership program. These services are listed in the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> columns. However, members access some Medicaid acute/primary services through their Medicaid Card. Services Family Care Partnership members access through the Medicaid Card include:
  - Behavioral treatment services
  - Comprehensive community services (CCS)
  - Community recovery services
  - Prenatal care coordination (PNCC)
  - School-based services
  - Medication therapy management

- Tuberculosis-related services
  - Prescription drugs (outpatient and physician-administered)
  - Residential substance use disorder treatment
  - Substance use disorder health home pilot program
- **Individuals enrolled in IRIS, Family Care, or Family Care Partnership may also be eligible for Medicare.**  
These individuals access most acute/primary services with their Medicare card. However, individuals enrolled in certain Family Care Partnership plans get both their Medicaid and Medicare services through the Family Care Partnership program. This is indicated by the dashed line in the chart above.
  - **Individuals enrolled in PACE access all Medicaid and Medicare services through the PACE program.**
