

History of CWC

Central Wisconsin Center (CWC) for the Developmentally Disabled is one of three residential facilities operated by the Department of Health Services. The Center has been providing quality service for people with intellectual disabilities and complex care needs since 1959.

CWC is located on a large campus covering over 105 acres next to a wild flower prairie. On the grounds are six residential units and two short-term assessment and treatment units. Over 800 staff members serve the needs of the 236 people residing at the Center.

We promote inclusion and participation in a team-focused environment. Together, we seek creative approaches to common issues.

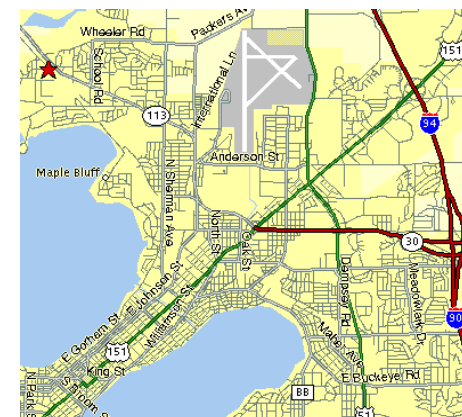
