

## STAP Behavioral/Psychiatric Assessment

Individuals receiving services in this program typically present significant behavioral challenges, such as self-injurious behavior (SIB), aggressive and destructive behaviors. Assessments include identification of the behavior function, desirable behaviors that might replace the challenging behavior as well as general intervention and support recommendations. Assessments of psychiatric issues are provided, treatment interventions are recommended, and in some cases, adjustments of current medications may be recommended and initiated. This program is not designed to manage individuals who present significant elopement or suicide risks or those who present serious risk for ingestion of inedible items.

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## SHORT TERM ASSESSMENT PROGRAM (STAP)

The Short Term Assessment Program is designed to meet the unique needs of children and adolescents with mild to profound intellectual disabilities combined with significant behavioral challenges and/or psychiatric needs. However, adults may also be offered services in this program. The STAP assessment team provides detailed comprehensive assessment of the individual's current status, responds to referral questions and provides recommendations for supporting the individual in his/her community living setting.

Admissions are determined following screening by STAP staff and approved by the Central Wisconsin Center Admission Committee. The length of stay is 5-28 days.
