## Resident Assessment Instrument (RAI) - BASICS Minimum Data Set (MDS) 3.0

### Program Content

This program, sponsored by the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, is a **BASIC Resident Assessment Instrument (RAI) training program**. This program is designed for nursing home staff who are new to using the Long Term Care Resident Assessment Instrument (RAI) that includes the Minimum Data Set (MDS); and for persons who need to update **BASIC** knowledge, skills and abilities in the RAI process. The program will affirm the role of assessment in providing quality of care and quality of life. It will review accurate coding of the MDS sections on an item by item basis, provide an overview of the federal regulations pertaining to the use of the RAI, and affirm the need to complete the MDS accurately and timely.

### Program Goals

The program will provide participants with information and instructions on using the Resident Assessment Instrument and explain coding of the MDS. After attending this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Define resident assessment requirements.
- Use the RAI in accordance with Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS) requirements.
- Accurately code the MDS using the required standard definitions.
- Apply the MDS triggering logic to the Care Area Assessment (CAA) process.
- Use the CAA process to further assess the functional status in triggered areas.
- Use the RAI process to develop a comprehensive care plan.

### Intended Audience

- Nursing home staff; including clinical nursing staff, directors of nursing, social workers, dietetic professionals, activity directors, rehabilitation therapists, administrators, health information professionals, and quality assurance monitors.
- Hospice staff that interface with nursing homes and want information about the RAI process and MDS.
- Others who have a desire to know more about the RAI and MDS or who need a refresher in the RAI process.
