# SPF SIG Goals and Objectives

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- Prevent the onset and reduce the progression of alcohol abuse, including childhood and underage drinking;
- Reduce substance abuse-related problems in communities;
- Build prevention capacity and infrastructure at the State and community levels.



# SPF SIG EXPECTATIONS

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- SPF executes a data-driven, five-step process where sustainability and cultural competence are woven throughout the five steps of the SPF.
  - Assessment
  - Capacity Building
  - Strategic Planning
  - Implementation
  - Evaluation



# SPF SIG EXPECTATIONS

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- A key requirement of the SPF SIG is the identification of the State's priorities
  - Underage drinking among 12-20 year olds;
  - Young adult binge drinking among 18-25 year olds;
  - Alcohol-related motor vehicle fatalities and injuries for individuals between the ages of 16-34

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This project focuses on the implementation of evidence-based ENVIRONMENTAL STRATEGIES which result in population level change. These strategies should focus on changing norms, substance use policies, or strengthening of existing regulations.

# SPF SIG Training Overview

  - Creation and continuation of partnerships,
  - Partnership agreements/memorandums,
  - Introduction of training and education to promote readiness, cultural competence, leadership and evaluation capacity,
  - Directory of key stakeholders, leaders and service providers,
  - Development of capacity development plans to enhance the communities ability to address underage drinking, and
  - Introduction to community readiness assessment.



# SPF SIG Training Overview

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- June 18 – 19, 2009 (Community Assessment)
  - Collection of data around local needs, intervening variables and contributing factors,
  - Development of clear, concise and data-driven problem statements,
  - Assessment of community readiness,
  - Assessment of cultural competence
  - Analysis of gaps and resources needed to address selected priority.



# SPF SIG Training Overview

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- July 21 0 22, 2009 (Finalizing strategic plan)
  - Identification of Contributing Factors,
  - Identification of Environmental Evidence Based Strategies,
  - Identification of Evaluation Measures
  - Development of a 12 month budget of no more than \$142,000.
