On behalf of the Division of Care and Treatment Services, which operates the state's three Intellectual and Developmental Disability Centers—Central Wisconsin Center, Northern Wisconsin Center, and Southern Wisconsin Center—the Department of Health Services is submitting its response to Wis. Stat. § 46.275(5m).

The Community Integration Program 1A (CIP1A) is a Medicaid home and community based waiver program serving people with intellectual and developmental disabilities. With the statewide implementation of Family Care, individuals no longer enroll in CIP1A. Consequently, in calendar year 2019, none of the state's centers had a Community Integration Program 1A discharge, and there was no employee impact attributable to CIP 1A.


