

Proclamation

WHEREAS; while progress has been made, underage drinking is especially severe in Wisconsin, with 28 percent of the state's high school students reporting alcohol use and 18 percent reporting binge drinking; and

WHEREAS; adults who provide alcohol to youth place them at risk for acute impairment and threaten their long-term development and well-being often with tragic health, social, and economic consequences; and

WHEREAS; in 2013, underage drinking cost the citizens of Wisconsin \$1 billion including medical care, work loss, and pain and suffering; and

WHEREAS; unless you are a parent, legal guardian, or spouse of an underage individual and are 21 years of age or older, it is illegal to sell, serve, or provide alcohol to underage individuals; and

WHEREAS; Wisconsin police departments routinely conduct both alcohol-age compliance checks at licensed establishments and rigorously enforce laws against selling, serving, or providing alcohol to underage youth; and

WHEREAS; 38 Wisconsin municipalities and seven counties have adopted ordinances with penalties up to \$5,000 for those who provide alcohol to underage youth; and

WHEREAS; parental support, monitoring, and communication can significantly reduce drinking among adolescents; and

WHEREAS; the Wisconsin departments of Health Services and Transportation are working together with 59 regional and local community coalitions and law enforcement to sponsor a statewide campaign to reduce underage drinking;


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Scott Walker, Governor of the state of Wisconsin, do hereby proclaim April 2016 as

TEEN ALCOHOL USE & ABUSE AWARENESS MONTH


throughout the state of Wisconsin and I commend this observance to all of our citizens.
