







Medicaid Programs that Would Benefit from Submitted Applications




Counties Represented in Submitted Applications







Grace Lutheran Communities

Eau Claire County | \$210,000

- Centers for seniors, aging adults, and school-age children
- Hired a recruiter/success coach for employees on January 2, 2023
 - Applicants are contacted within 24 hours
 - Links employees to community resources
- New hires are on track to increase 138% over 2022



Capri Senior Communities

1 of 2

Ozaukee County \$907,000

- On January 8, 2023, launched a four-day work week at two pilot locations
 - Village Pointe Commons and Harbor Campus
 - Staff work 32 hours, but are paid for 40
- Improved recruitment, increased retention, and reduced burnout
 - Driven primarily by word of mouth
- Potential to expand to 18 senior living campuses in southern Wisconsin
 - Campuses serve 2,200 seniors daily







Capri Senior Communities

2 of 2

Ozaukee County | \$907,000

Harbor Campus

- Started with dining staff
 - 3,000% increase in applications
 - Fully staffed kitchen in three weeks after months of no applications
- Expanded to caregivers after success with kitchen recruitment
 - 1,500% increase in caregiver applications
 - Filled 70% of open positions in just two weeks

Great Lakes Senior Living

Racine County | \$42,100

- Network of three senior care communities
- Trained 67 staff members as certified dementia practitioners
 - Typically only supervisors receive such training
- Of those trained, seven employees certified as trainers
 - Employee instructors will then train an additional 16 staff in fall
- Staff can now better care for residents by recognizing their specific cognitive needs

Foundations Counseling Center

Dane/Green Counties

\$345,000

- Mental health counseling center
- Retained all 15 therapists and hired an additional one
- Provided mental health services to
 52 new clients and families
 - In-home, telehealth, and group therapy
- Bought and distributed telehealth devices to clients in 10 counties
- Overall, reduced barriers to treatment and increased the mental health of clients and families

Valley Packaging Inc. Center

Outagamie County \$242,740

- Community rehabilitation center
- Offers vocational training and other programs for individuals with disabilities or disadvantages
- Created a community inclusion manager position
 - Schedules outings, speakers, tours and volunteer opportunities for clients
- Clients forge connections with local businesses and larger community
