


No Wrong Door – Supporting Kids Together

Scope

Children with special health care needs:

"...those who have or are at increased risk for a chronic physical, developmental, behavioral, or emotional condition and who also require health and related services of a type or amount beyond that required by children generally."

Scope, cont.

Children and youth with:

- ✓ Delays or disabilities who require services of a type or amount beyond that required by children generally
- ✓ Physical or medical conditions who require services of a type or amount beyond that required by children generally
- ✓ Behavioral health needs
 - "The promotion of mental health, resilience and wellbeing; the treatment of mental and substance use disorders; and the support of those who experience and/or are in recovery from these conditions, along with their families and communities." (SAMHSA)

DHS Collaboration

Division of Medicaid Services

- Administers programs that serve children with delays or disabilities
- Examples: Children's Long-Term Support (CLTS) Program, Birth to 3 Program, and Katie Beckett Medicaid

Division of Care and Treatment Services

- Oversees, supports, and funds community-based behavioral health and human services providers
- Mental health and substance use programs
- Examples: Comprehensive Community Services (CCS) and Coordinated Services Teams Initiative (CST)

Division of Public Health

- Oversees the Children and Youth with Special Health Care Needs (CYSHCN) Program and its five regional centers
- Goal of the CYSHCN Program is to assure that children and youth with special health care needs are identified early, receive high-quality coordinated care, and receive (with their families) the supports they need
