Annual Performance Report Findings-Improvement Strategies:

The ICC was briefed about the child and family outcomes results reported in the Annual Performance Report (APR) and next steps to improvement data, demographic representation and survey responses. Comments were gathered from the ICC to inform the work.

American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funding Recommendations and Request Council Input:

A review of what is currently known and unknown about the ARPA funds was shared. ICC members with expertise in any of the strategies identified by the department were encouraged to participate in a mini-think tank group being formed. Ginger Brath volunteered. ICC members have until May 12, 2021, to contact Deb Rathermel about interest.

Bureau of Children's Services (BCS) Updates:

Budget Updates

The Joint Finance Committee within the state legislature is currently developing and reviewing budget proposals after statewide listening sessions. Three items related to the Birth to 3 Program were proposed in Governor Evers' state budget: 1) additional general purpose revenue (GPR) funding which had been in last budget; 2) strategies to identify and address lead exposure, including necessary funds to provide services to children exposed to lead and changing the eligibility criteria to match Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) criteria; and 3) a provision to increase the payment rate for speech therapy services through Medicaid.

Annual Submissions: Part C Grant Application and State Systemic Improvement Plan

BCS submitted the annual Part C grant application to the Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) on May 3.

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Wisconsin received a \$45.00 increase to the annual grant this year. The State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) report was submitted to OSEP in April.

Part C Procedure Guide

A Part C program manual guide has been drafted to provide programs with all fundamental information about the requirements of the program in one place. The guide is currently being reviewed by local program staff and partners for input. Once finalized, this guide will be posted to our website and will be updated as needed for ongoing program guidance.

COVID-19 and Program Impacts

BCS has issued ongoing guidance to programs about flexibilities to apply during COVID-19, and all flexibilities remain in effect at this time. The Birth to 3 Program continues to have low enrollment, a 15-17% reduction in numbers.

The public service announcement (PSA) campaign will support universal messaging and emphasize the necessity of intervening early. ICC members were asked to provide into the PSA materials by May 12, 2021. A recommendation was made to be up front about what services we provide and how we are delivering them.
