Welcome:

• Julie Walsh (Chair) called the meeting to order at 9:06 a.m. and welcomed council members, Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) staff participating in the conference call.

General Business:

Council Briefing

Part C Grant Briefing

This item included an overview of the Part C Grant, timeline, and amount of allocation of grant funds. Part C funds are allocated from the federal Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) for early intervention services for children age birth through 2 years of age.

- o Amy Pulda presented the proposed FY 2022 OSEP allocation similar to our previous years' categories:
 - Category I Staff Positions–\$475,000
 Category II Supports and subcontracts –\$1,128,891
 - o Category III Direct Services–\$6,050,890
- The grant application will be posted for public comment in March and a final application with be sent to OSEP in May.
- o No comments or questions were shared from council.

Data Briefing: Child Outcomes

This item included a review of Indicator 3 Child Outcomes data previously shared with the ICC on January 26, 2022.

Indicator 3 Child Outcomes includes six data points measuring the impact of Birth to 3 Program services in three areas of child development: A) social-emotional skills, B) acquisition and C) use of knowledge and skills and taking appropriate actions to meet needs.

• Council members discussed the possible impacts of diagnosis after eligibility, duration of time in the program, frequency of services, and age at eligibility on child outcomes.

- Council members discussed the benefit of continued analysis to determine correlations between and among child outcomes by the selected data points and demographics.
- Council members discussed limitations of data collected in the Program Participation System (PPS) data system, possible data system improvements and funds that may support system improvements.
- Council members expressed a need for standardization among programs, online training, and standard expectations.
- The Bureau of Children's Services (BCS) shared the next steps will include continue analysis of populations by overlapping data and continued activities to improved child outcomes including:
 - o Updated scoring of Indicator 3 data in local county determinations
 - o Continued implementation of Social Emotional grant activities
 - Monitoring and identification of quality practices through administration of the statewide Birth to 3
 Program Review Protocol
 - o American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) activities aimed to support improved child outcomes

BCS Update

ARPA Briefing & Input

- BCS staff shared information about the supplemental federal ARPA funds provided to mitigate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic particularly children and families that have been disproportionately affected.
- Additional details were shared about ARPA projects and activities including: reimagining of the Birth to 3
 Program professional development (PD) system, research project on evidenced-based practices, and early

Annual Performance Report (APR) Improvement Project

- Lydia Essenmacher reviewed the state of the APR Improvement Strategies project and workgroup. This project is closing after completion of:
 - o New survey and process for collection of family outcomes data
 - o Development of the child outcomes dashboard
 - o develop new scoring system for local county determinations and update required local county determinations follow up activities
- In addition to these activities, it was noted that BCS is launching the activities discussed in ARPA briefing to continue efforts to increase child outcomes.
- Council members are interested in future updates on these activities and additional data to better understand the scope of activities and the scope of data BCS is collecting.
