RHTP - Background

- On 7/4, the One Big Beautiful Bill Act was signed into law.
- The Act established a \$50 billion federal Rural Health Transformation Program (RHTP) to improve rural health care (KFF).
 - The RHTP will be administered through CMS at the federal level through competitive allocations to states.
 - The Act and CMS will determine how funds are spent.
 - Allocated funds are expected to flow through DHS to support health system transformation in Wisconsin (if our application is accepted by CMS).

RHTP - Background

- According to the Act, key themes will include:
 - Technology enhancements to improve care delivery in rural areas
 - Clinician workforce incentives in rural areas
 - Financial support for rural health facilities
 - Prevention, chronic disease, and mental health initiatives

RHTP – Funding

- \$50 billion over 5 years to states (FFY 2026 to 2030)
 - \$25 billion divided equally among all successful applicants
 - \$25 billion at discretion of CMS administrator
 - Allocations should consider:
 - Percent of population in a rural census tract
 - Proportion of rural health facilities (compared to national proportion)
 - ◆ Situation of hospitals that serve low-income patients with special needs

RHTP – Allowable Activities

Each state must do <u>3 or more</u> of the following:

- Recruit and retain clinical workforce talent to rural areas, with a 5-year commitment
- Provide payments to providers for health care items or services
- Develop projects that support innovative models of care (value-based care, alternative payments)
- Promote sustainable access to high quality rural health care services
- Assist rural communities to right size their health care delivery systems (preventative, ambulatory, pre-hospital, emergency, acute inpatient care, outpatient care, and post-acute care services)
- Support access to opioid use disorder treatment, substance use treatment, and mental health services

- Provide training and technical assistance to develop and adopt technology-enabled solutions to improve care delivery in rural hospitals (remote monitoring, robotics, AI)
- Provide technical assistance, software, and hardware for IT advances to improve efficiency, enhance cybersecurity capacity, and improve health outcomes
- Promote consumer-facing, technology-driven solutions for the prevention and management of chronic diseases
- Promote evidence-based, measurable intervention to improve prevention and chronic disease management

RHTP – Provider Types

"Rural Health Facilities"

- Hospital located in a rural area
- Critical access hospital
- Sole community hospital
- Medicare-dependent, small rural hospital
- Low-volume hospital
- Rural emergency hospital
- Rural health clinic
- Federally qualified health center
- Community mental health center
- Health center that is receiving a grant under section 330 of the Public Health Service Act
- Opioid treatment program located in a rural census tract of an MSA
- o Certified community behavioral health clinic located in a rural census tract of an MSA

RHTP - DHS Priorities

- Expand on past initiatives and address known challenges:
 - Task Force on the Healthcare Workforce
 - Interagency Council on Mental Health
 - ARPA Initiatives
 - Hospital Services Grant Program (Proposed)

RHTP - DHS Priorities

- Collaborative or regionally coordinated approaches that strengthen care across service areas
- Opportunities to support workforce, infrastructure, and technology in rural areas
- Insights into gaps or barriers in the current system that limit access, quality, or innovation

- Strategies that are designed for long-term sustainability
- Initiatives that could transform rural health care delivery, especially in primary care, behavioral health, OB/GYN care, emergency care, EMS services, and complex care

This RFI does not constitute a solicitation of proposals, a commitment to conduct procurement, an offer to contract, or a prospective contract. No contract will be awarded by DHS as a result of this RFI. DHS will not be liable for any costs incurred by respondents in the preparation and submission of information in response to this RFI. All RFI responses become the property of the State of Wisconsin and will not be returned. Responses will be kept confidential if a solicitation for the same or similar services is expected in the future. A formal Request for Proposals (RFP) or grant application process may follow at a later stage.

DHS welcomes responses from any interested party, such as:

- Behavioral health and substance use disorder treatment providers
- Community-based organizations
- Educational institutions and health care workforce programs
- Emergency Medical Services organizations
- Federally Qualified Health Centers and rural health clinics

- Hospitals and health systems
- Local governments
- Rural resident, patients, and advocates
- Tribal health organizations
- Potential vendors, such as software companies or information technology platforms

Required RFI Questions

- Option 1 (Recommended) total limit 2,500 words
- 1. Identify allowable activities (from the list of 10)
- 2. Abstract
 - Provide a high-level summary of your input or idea
- 3. Organizational background and experience
 - Describe your organization
 - Identify lead entity and key contact person(s)

Required RFI Questions

- Option 1 (Recommended) total limit 2,500 words
 - 4. Detailed response
 - High-level summary of the idea; identify corresponding RHTP required activities
 - Quantify the community need behind this idea; describe anticipated impact
 - Outline your sustainability strategy beyond RHTP funding
 - 5. Implementation strategy
 - Identify key partners and their roles
 - Describe your organization's capacity and readiness to implement the idea and provide a high-level timeline for implementation activities, if applicable
 - Identify any major implementation risks or barriers and briefly describe mitigation strategies for any financial or operational risks

Required RFI Questions

Option 2 (NOT Recommended) – total limit 2,500 words

General Input or Feedback

This is an open format option. Responses do not need to follow a set structure. Respondents may submit data to identify rural health care challenges, narrative responses describing regional challenges, gaps in the current system or continuum of care, written reflections, emergency community needs or ideas, and any other feedback on how the Department should approach its application for RHTP funds.

How to Submit a Response to the RFI

Responses due by <u>September 3 at 2:00pm</u>

Option 1: Respond by Email

- Attachments in Microsoft format are preferred, submitted as PDF, Microsoft Word, Adobe, Microsoft Excel, or PowerPoint files.
