

Getting to Know DHS and BCS

- The Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) is committed to protecting and promoting the health and safety of the people of Wisconsin, making sure everyone can live their best life.
- The Bureau of Children's Services (BCS) runs the CLTS Program at the state level.
 - BCS works with counties, which operate the program locally.

About CLTS

- The CLTS Program provides community-based supports and services from birth through age 21 for eligible children with long-term support needs.
- CLTS offers more than 30 different supports and services.
- The program now serves over 27,000 children.



The Goal of the CLTS Program

Help children with disabilities live at home and better participate in their family and community life. It includes services and supports that help children:

- Complete daily living tasks
- Enhance relationships with family, friends and community
 members
- Learn new skills and develop new interests

- Achieve their best physical and mental health
- Keep living at home
- Live their best life



The CLTS Program Waiver

- A waiver allows Medicaid to fund additional services and supports not normally covered to help children stay in their homes and communities.
- Wisconsin must get permission from the federal government to waive certain Medicaid requirements to fund these additional services.



Medicaid vs. CLTS Program

Medicaid

- Regular health check-ups
- Any medically necessary services and aids
- Skilled nursing and personal care

CLTS Waiver Program

- Respite
- Skill development
- Adaptive aids
- Home modifications



The CLTS Program Waiver Renewal

- The CLTS Program is renewed and federally approved every five years.
 - Current renewal period: 2022-2026
 - Next renewal period: 2027-2031
- Each renewal period requires DHS to submit a new waiver application for CLTS.



The CLTS Program Waiver Renewal

 The CLTS Program Waiver application covers many different parts of the program.

Eligibility, services provided, self-direction, and others

 This is our opportunity to make changes to things covered in the waiver application.

This lets us improve the program for the next five years to better serve children and families.



Guiding Principles

- Every child should live their best possible life now and into the future.
- Children are best served with their family and in the community.
- DHS strives to create a CLTS program that is equitable and inclusive.



Scope of the Waiver Renewal

While the waiver renewal is an opportunity to make changes to the CLTS Program, some larger changes are not within the scope of the project.

In scope

- Service package
- Provider qualifications

Out of scope

- Payment model
- Operational structure



Potential Changes to the CLTS Waiver

DHS is identifying possible changes to the waiver that improve the CLTS Program in three important ways:

- Consistency in the CLTS Program experience.
- Timely access and coordination of benefits.
- Program administration and operational efficiency.

How Your Feedback will Inform the Waiver Renewal


Your input will help shape the program for children with disabilities and their families for the next CLTS waiver cycle (2027 to 2031).
