## **Testing after June 15th**

DHS will continue to support respiratory outbreak testing (including COVID) at WSLH.

- Only 3-5 specimens per outbreak will be tested to establish the virus circulating.
- This may or may not be sufficient to meet CMS mandates in place at that time.
- If additional testing is needed, facilities should set up their own contracts with labs.




