

The COVID-19 emergency may end this year. If it does, Wisconsin Medicaid rules will change. If you are over 65 and getting Wisconsin Medicaid, make sure you enroll in Medicare before March 31 so you do not have a gap in coverage or lose your health insurance.

You could lose your health insurance if you:

- Turned 65 in the last two years.
- Did not enroll in Medicare.
- Have Wisconsin Medicaid now but no longer meet the program rules when it is time to renew.

Contact the Social Security Administration by March 31 to see if you can enroll in Medicare.
