Subject: Reimbursement for Mental Health High Cost Placements Ordered by a Tribal Court

Document Summary

Under 2009 Wisconsin Act 318 the Legislature has authorized up to \$250,000 to fund high cost mental health placements of Tribal members when county or Tribal costs exceed \$50,000 annually and when the treatment services are ordered by a Tribal court. This appropriation is continuing and available to eligible Tribes and/or counties for state fiscal year 2014.

Background

2009 Wisconsin Act 318 authorized up to \$250,000 of Tribal gaming revenues to fund high cost mental health placements of Tribal members when county or Tribal costs exceed \$50,000 annually. This appropriation is continuing and available to eligible counties and tribes. These mental health placements must be ordered by a Tribal court under Tribal ordinances comparable to Chapter 51.20, the mental health commitment statute which authorizes circuit courts to commit individuals for mental health treatment. Funds for this special allocation are transferred to the Department of Health Services from unspent Tribal gaming funds for the period ending June 30, 2014.

The expenses for treatment costs can be incurred and claimed by either a tribe or a county department of human services, community programs or social services. Funding up to \$250,000 is available for eligible expenses incurred during the period July 1, 2013, through June 30, 2014. Expenditures for the cost of mental health placements must exceed \$50,000 during this time period.

Criteria on Use of These Funds

The criteria for the use of these funds include:

1. Any member of an Indian Tribe or band who has been court ordered for mental health placement by a Tribal court.
2. Placements eligible to be considered for reimbursement under this Act must be made for the primary purpose of mental health treatment. This could include individuals who are developmentally disabled or who have a co-occurring substance abuse diagnosis.
3. The county or tribe may request reimbursement after the total annual expenditure for allowable services has exceeded \$50,000.
4. The placements must be ordered by the Tribal Court under Tribal ordinances comparable to Chapter 51.20 to be eligible for reimbursement.

All requests for reimbursement from this funding source **must be submitted by September 30, 2014**. If requests for funding exceed available funds, allocations will be pro-rated based on total approved funding requests.

Up to \$250,000 may be available again for SFY 15 for the period July 1, 2014, through June 30, 2015, based on availability of Tribal gaming revenues. If this funding is available, instructions for applying for these funds will be shared in the spring of 2015. The criteria for the use of those funds will be similar to the criteria this year.
