New DCTS Senior Managers

The Division of Care and Treatment Services (DCTS) has two new senior managers. These hires complete the final phase of the reorganization that created DCTS.

Assistant Administrator

Holly Audley is the DCTS Assistant Administrator. She oversees the management of mental health and substance use programming for public sector community services.

The directors of the Bureau of Community Forensic Services and the Bureau of Prevention Treatment and Recovery report to Audley. She will lead ongoing efforts to develop approaches that increase access to community-based behavioral health services and better integrate these services across the civil and forensic systems.

She assumed the position on April 17, 2017.

Audley comes to the Department of Health Services (DHS) from the Department of Corrections (DOC) where she served as the evidence-based program manager. In this role, she supported the implementation of evidence-based rehabilitation programming in aggression and affect regulation, cognitive/behavioral interventions, domestic violence treatment, sex offender treatment, substance use disorders, pre-release transitional services, and prosocial supportive services. Previously she served as an education director and principal for DOC institutional services. She has a master's degree in education.

Director of the Bureau of Community Forensic Services

Beth Dodsworth is the director of the Bureau of Community Forensic Services. This bureau combines community-based programs serving clients with criminal justice histories into one administrative structure. It includes the Forensic Mental Health Section, which oversees the Conditional Release Program, Court Liaison Services, Opening Avenues to Reentry Success (OARS), Outpatient Competency Examination Program, Outpatient Competency Restoration Program, and the Supervised Release Section, which supports the placement of men with histories of sexual offenses moving from Sand Ridge Secure Treatment Center to the community.

She assumed the position on January 9, 2017.

This is a promotion for Dodsworth, who has worked in a variety of roles at DHS, including forensic social worker, conditional release specialist, and conditional release program manager. Most recently, she was the acting director of the Office of Community Forensic Services. She is a licensed clinical social worker.
