**SUBJECT: 2012 Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA)**

**CROSS REFERENCE:** [MEH](#)

**EFFECTIVE DATE:** JANUARY 1, 2012

**BACKGROUND:**

The Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) for 2012 is **3.6%** for the Social Security Administration (SSA) Old Age Survivors and Disability Insurance (OASDI or Title II) and Supplemental Security Income (SSI or Title XVI) programs.

The federal COLA increase will result in changes in CARES Worker Web (CWW) to the (MA) income levels, allowances and deductions as outlined in pages 5 - 10 of this memo. The changes associated with these adjustments will be included in a future MEH release.

The Social Security (SS) Auto Update process will update Social Security amounts in CWW at the COLA mass change. The monthly SS auto-update will still occur prior to December adverse action. There is only one SS auto-update in December.

CARES eligibility re-determinations for January 2012 will occur as part of the COLA mass change on the weekend of December 3, 2011.

➤**NOTE:** SSI amounts will not be updated in CWW through the COLA mass change. SSI amounts will continue to be auto-updated on a weekly basis. The increase in federal SSI payments will appear as an auto-update after adverse action in December 2011 and will impact February 2012 benefits. The regular SSI auto-update alerts will be generated when these amounts change.

There will not be a COLA increase in State SSI Supplement or SSI-E payment amounts; however these amounts may be changed in the auto-update process for other reasons.

## **CARES:**

### MASS CHANGE

Data updates are made based upon information received from the Social Security Administration (SSA) related to COLA increases to social security benefits (i.e., disability, survivor, and retirement). The Medicare Part B premium amount is also updated based upon the yearly amount set in federal law. For calendar year 2012, the federal benefit COLA increase is **3.6%** of the current benefit.

The Mass Change will update the following fields on the CARES Unearned Income page and Medicare page:

- Social Security Benefit
- SSA/COLA DAC Disregard
- QMB/SLMB "Current" Disregard
- SSA Claim Number
- Social Security Payment Subtype
- All Fields on the Medicare Page

For each person in a W-2, Child Care, BadgerCare Plus, Medicaid, Family Care Assistance Group (AG), or FoodShare (FS) AG that is open or has been closed less than 30 days, CARES will update the SSA benefit amount with an effective date of 01/12. Because SeniorCare uses an annual budgeting process, SC-only cases will not be updated automatically.

When applicable, the CARES Medicare Page will be updated with the increased Medicare Part B premium amount. The premium payor will be updated on the CWW Medicare Page if SSA data differs from that in CARES.

### ALERTS

The following alerts require further action by the worker:

#### **369 SS INFO UPD AND DISCREP EXISTS**

The auto-update process adds together the net SS income of all SS income types on the Unearned Income Page, plus any Medicare premium on the Medicare Page, plus any SS recoupments. These three amounts are also shown on DXSA. The total is then matched against the gross SSA income on the BENDEX file. If that total does not match, there could be a discrepancy (possible garnishments being taken from SS income for child support, back taxes, etc.). If a mismatch is found, the Unearned Income Page will be updated with the net amount and this alert will be set for the worker. The worker must follow up with SSA to

determine the reason for the discrepancy. The worker will need to determine the difference in the gross versus the net and enter this amount as OT income on the Unearned Income Page.

### **349 ELIG NOT DET AT MC/AA RUN SFEX**

This alert indicates that the case did not go through mass change or adverse action because it is exceptioned off. These are the cases that appear on the EOS Exception report C306. This report includes cases with overrides, cases with person add/deletes that have not been confirmed, FoodShare cases closed less than 30 days and AGs in pending status. These cases are also listed on the monthly mass change report C307. For these cases, you must run SFEX to determine eligibility and confirm when you get the correct determination. If you do not run SFEX and confirm before Adverse Action (AA), you must run SFEX with the recurring month's date. For FS cases, issue a supplement or create an overpayment claim based on the correct eligibility.

The following alerts will not be set due to the large number of individuals involved.

When the COLA record includes Railroad Retirement, the case will not be automatically updated. The following alerts will be generated and sent to the primary worker and alternate worker when the update did not occur:

### **379 SSA INDICATES RAILROAD BENEFIT**

This alert will be generated to the primary worker whenever the record from SSA indicates that the individual is receiving Railroad Benefits.

### **380 SSA INDICATES RR BENEFIT**

This alert will be generated to the alternate worker whenever the record from SSA indicates that the individual is receiving Railroad Benefits.

➤**NOTE:** The alert help text on the mainframe page CUAH provides information on why the alert was generated and what action needs to be taken by the worker.

### **MEDICARE SAVINGS PROGRAMS, MEDICAID PURCHASE PLAN (MAPP) & COLA DISREGARD**

Special processing is done for Medicare Savings Programs (QMB, SLMB, QDWI) and MAPP members when their Social Security benefits are increased by the COLA. Federal law prohibits using their 2012 Social Security benefit amounts to determine financial eligibility until after the 2012 Federal Poverty Levels (FPL) are published by the federal government. This is to prevent some of these cases from closing due to their income increasing before the higher FPL limits take effect. For this reason, the COLA increases that appear with the January checks are to be disregarded. In December 2011, the CARES COLA mass change stores the COLA increase on the Unearned Income page in the "CURRENT DISREGARD" field. For Medicare Savings Programs and MAPP cases run after the COLA updates are made in CARES and before the FPL limits are updated, CARES automatically subtracts the COLA increase from the member's income before comparing it to the eligibility income limits. In addition, CARES subtracts the "CURRENT DISREGARD" from the member's income before comparing it to the income limits for MAPP premiums.

For new Medicare Savings Programs and MAPP applications processed after December 3, 2011 enter the 2012 COLA amount in the "Current Disregard" field in addition to the 2012 Social Security benefit amount on the (CWW) Unearned Income page. Once entered, CARES will subtract the "Current Disregard" from the Social security income when determining eligibility for benefits and the MAPP premium. When CARES is updated with the 2012 FPL limits, the "Current Disregard" amount will be ignored by CARES. That will result in the eligibility for Medicare Savings Program and MAPP members and the MAPP premiums being determined using the 2012 Social Security benefit amounts.

### REPORTS

CARES data now matches SSA data more accurately since we are automatically updating SSA records on a monthly basis. We anticipate the number of exceptions generated during the mass change to be greatly reduced. For the exceptions that do result, we have identified a number of reports that local agencies can use to resolve these exceptions.

Reference table updates are being made to four CARES tables that are used in determining MA eligibility. The updates will be effective on January 1, 2012 or CARES tables TMEP, TASP, and TSCA. Updates to table TCDP have already been completed through **2011**. Changes to these tables are required because of changes in the federal portion of the SSI payment level upon which the MA income limits are based or because of a change in the Consumer Price Index (CPI).

➤**NOTE:** Changes to TMST will not be needed this year because the AFDC-related and the SSI-related medically needy limits are capped at **\$591.67** for group sizes of 1 and 2.
