NEED EXTRA CASH?

WISCONSIN AND FEDERAL EARNED INCOME TAX CREDITS

You may be eligible for both Wisconsin and federal earned income tax credits if you worked any time in 2017. You may be able to get a combined total of state and federal credits up to:

- \$8,466 if you have three or more children and family income less than \$48,340 (single), \$53,930 (married).
- \$6,234 if you have two children and family income less than \$45,007 (single), \$50,597 (married).
- \$3,536 if you have one child and family income less than \$39,617 (single), \$45,207 (married).
- \$510 if you have no children and family income less than \$15,010 (single), \$20,600 (married).

NOTE: All earned income tax credits are not necessarily counted as income when determining an individual's eligibility or benefit amount for W-2, Job Access Loans, Emergency Assistance, Refugee Assistance Programs, Transform Milwaukee Jobs/Transitional Jobs, Wisconsin Shares Child Care Subsidy, FoodShare, Wisconsin Medicaid, BadgerCare Plus, Family Planning Only Services, and Caretaker Supplement. Please check with your program for details.

FEDERAL CHILD TAX CREDIT

You may be eligible for a maximum federal tax credit of up to \$1,000 per dependent child under age 17. This tax credit lowers the amount of income tax you owe, and if the amount of the tax credit is greater than the amount of income tax you owe, you may be able to receive an Additional Child Tax Credit. FEDERAL CHILD AND DEPENDENT CARE CREDIT

You may be able to claim the Child and Dependent Care Credit if you paid work-related expenses for the care of children, adult dependents, or an incapacitated spouse. The maximum credit is **\$2,100** and depends on family income and the amount of qualified care expenses. More detailed information can be found at https://www.irs.gov/taxtopics/tc602.html.

WISCONSIN HOMESTEAD CREDIT

You may be eligible for a maximum tax credit of up to **\$1,168** if you were a Wisconsin resident for all of 2017, owned or rented a dwelling, and had a household income less than \$24,680 for 2017. Individuals are not eligible for the Homestead Credit if they received a W-2 payment in <u>every</u> month of 2017.
