State Medical Director Report	Martens	 Dr. Martens talked about her visit to NASEMSO. At this conference, they reviewed Hypoglycemia, MIA. Dr. Martens mentioned other states were having problems getting paid for MIA. There are some potential legislative changes in other states. She provided information about REPLICA . Discussion and support of Compass program and evidence based guidelines. Office is investigating Medicaid reimbursement opportunities.
		The HCCs passed an initiative for supplying law enforcement officers 10,000 tourniquets around the state using carryover funds. Hoping HCC will provide an update on the training. Legislators are being approached about the use of insulin by EMS. Legislators requested information from the EMS Office on why EMS does not carry it. EMSC Report	Kim	 Please review committee report. New physician Dr. Brooke Lerner has joined the group as the Academic Research position. Surplus funding was initially denied, but carryover funds were approved and only have 1 month to spend them. Purchased \$500 worth of comfort kits with the carryover. Three new EMSC performance measures were introduced: Performance measure-The degree to which EMS agencies submit NEMSIS compliant version 3.x data to the State EMS Office for submission to NEMSIS Technical Assistance Center (TAC). Performance measure-The percentage of EMS agencies in the state/territory that have a designated individual who coordinates pediatric emergency care. Performance measure-The percentage of EMS agencies in the state/territory that have a process that requires EMS providers to physically demonstrate the correct use of pediatric-specific equipment. Planning on doing more ongoing simulation based training next year. Developing subcommittee to review availability of EMS and training conferences around the state. Still recruiting a Pediatric Emergency Physician to be on PAC.
