

"Hospital Bioterrorism Preparedness Plan"

- A statewide cooperative disaster plan for hospitals – prepared by DHFS
- Coordinates resources on a region-byregion level
- Stratifies events into local, regional, state and national scope
- Identifies interfaces between hospitals and prehospital resources, including:

 Local Emergency Operations Center (EOC)
 Incident Command System (ICS) of local responders



- Scene Safety and Personal Protective Equipment
 - o CBNRE agents threaten EMS personnel
 - Direct Involvement
 - Secondary Contamination
 - o Secondary Devices
 - o Personal Protection
 - Same as hazmat incidents
 - Mark I auto-injectors
 - o Incident Command System
 - Safety Officer

- Education and Training for Prehospital Providers
 - o NT 100 Terrorism and Hazardous Materials Awareness Course
 - 4 hours
 - Mandated training for all prehospital providers in 2003-2004
 - There will be ongoing refresher training for bioterrorism in the future

- Bioterrorism events are crime scenes!
 - o Law enforcement officials will establish perimeters
 - o EMS personnel need appropriate identification to enter
 - o EMS personnel must understand the importance of crime scene preservation

Decontamination

- o Hazmat events:
 - Disrobing removes 70-80% of contaminants
 - Soap and water
 - Rinsates pose some risk of harm to environment
- o Biological Agents:
 - Disrobing first may cause re-aerosolization
 - Consider dilute bleach solutions
 - Rinsates: significant risk to environment

- Issues for Emergency Departments
 - o Interface with local public health officials
 - o Availability of antidotes, antitoxins and antibiotics
 - o Strategic National Stockpile
 - o Staff education and training
 - o Decontamination

- Local Public Health Department (LPHD)

 Report all suspicious illnesses to your LPHD
 They are your link to State and Federal Resources
 - o Plans are being made for statewide syndromic surveillance systems
 - o Linkages with State and Federal resources
 - o LPHD provides linkage to strategic national stockpile
 - o Linkages with Metropolitan Medical Response Systems (MMRS)
 - Milwaukee
 - Madison

 - o What specimens should you collect?
 - o Where do you send them?
 - o When will the results become available?
 - o Will they help you to guide therapy?
