

Overview of EVV

- Federally mandated 21st Century Cures Act requires EVV for Medicaid-covered personal care services (PCS) and HHCS.
- States that do not implement EVV risk losing Medicaid funding.


EVV for Personal Care and Certain Supportive Home Care Services

- T1019, T1020, S5125, and S5126 service codes have required EVV since November 2, 2020
- EVV hard launch is May 1, 2023

Overview of EVV

The DHS strives to ensure:

- EVV is "minimally burdensome"
- Best practices are applied and existing uses of EVV are researched
- EVV systems are Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act compliant and secure
- Training opportunities are available to providers

Overview of EVV—Guiding Principles

- Maintain level of services provided
- Support provider selection
- Keep individual's choice of worker
- Ensure needed care is delivered

Overview of EVV

Program areas with HHCS that require EVV:

- Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus fee-for-service (ForwardHealth card)
- BadgerCare Plus and SSI HMOs
- Family Care and Family Care Partnership

Service	Service Codes
Treatment of speech, language, voice, communication, and/or auditory processing disorder; individual [per visit]	92507
Unlisted therapeutic procedure (specify) [per visit]	97139
Unlisted physical medicine/rehabilitation service or procedure [per visit]	97799

Proposed HHCS Codes for Nursing

Service	Service Codes
Unlisted home visit service or procedure [per visit]	99600
Home visit for mechanical ventilation care [per hour]	99504*
Nursing care; in home; by registered nurse, per hour	S9123*
Nursing care; in home; by licensed practical nurse, per hour	S9124*

^{*} Independent nurses and nurses at provider agencies may conduct these services.

Service	Service Codes
Nursing assessment/evaluation [per visit]	T1001
Home health aide or certified nurse assistant, per visit	T1021
Administration of oral, intramuscular and/or subcutaneous medication by health care agency/professional, per visit	T1502
Skilled nursing services - Home Visit Wound Care - removed	S9097
Skilled nursing services - RN/LPN Home Care per day removed	T1030/T1031

Proposed Code for PCS Supervisory Visit

Service	Service Codes
Home visit for assistance with activities of daily living and personal care (per visit)	99509

EVV for HHCS—Timeline

DHS decided to create two phases of the EVV timeline:

- Soft launch by January 1, 2024
- Hard launch sometime in 2024



EVV for HHCS—Training

- DHS will use train-the-trainer model
- Training will be needed for administrators and home health care workers
- Resources will be provided



EVV Awareness and Experience


- 56 percent have heard of EVV
- 44 percent have not heard of EVV



HHCS Provider Agency Survey

Workers per Agency

- 4.5% had 201 or more
- 3.6% had 101 to 200
- 2.7% had 51 to 100
- □ 1.8% had 26 to 50
- 84.5% had 1 to 25
- \square 2.7% had 0 workers



HHCS Provider Agency Survey

Administrative Training Preferences

- 77 percent self-guided online videos
- 52 percent self-guided online printed materials
- 50 percent virtual trainings with a live Q&A session to answer any questions
- 28 percent personalized support during one-on-one phone conversations


