

Who receives FoodShare Benefits in Wisconsin?


- **Poverty:** 10% of the 5.6 million people in Wisconsin receive FS.² On average from 1998 - 2000, 8.8% of the state population was at or below the federal poverty rate.³
- **Assistance Groups (AG's)/Individuals:** 247,231 Assistance groups are made up of 574,977 individuals. The AG's count increased by 7,052 from the Previous Month. There is an average of 2.3 people in an AG.

- **Gender:** 56% of the recipients are female and 44% are male.
- **Adults/Minors:** 53% are adults and 47% are minors. 53% of AG's have minors in them.

Adult Status and Gender



- **Minors and Their Parents:** Of the AG's that contain minors, 66% have one parent in the AG, 32% have two parents, and 2% have no parents in the household. "Parent" is defined as a biological or adoptive parent.







- Parents That Are Minors:** There are 1,238 minors in 1,217 FS AG's that are parents. A slightly higher number than last month and comprises 1/5 of 1 percent of the individuals that receive FS.
- Case Composition:** The table and graph shows other types of CARES issued assistance that a FS AG receives.




- Historical Caseload Trend:** The statewide caseload grew last month to over 247 thousand, contributing to a 33% increase over 12 months.




- First Time FS AG's:** This chart shows the number of first-time FS assistance groups over the last 2 years. Only AG's that have never received FS in Wisconsin before the month shown, appear in this chart. In April, 6,401 FS AG's received FS for the first time.



- Age Distribution:** The chart below shows the number of FS recipients by age, in 5 year increments. Children age 4 and under has the largest number for any five year grouping making up 17% of recipients. Half of the recipients are 19 and younger.



- **Elderly/Disabled:** 16% of FS recipients are either elderly, blind, or disabled. 34% of AG's contain at least one individual that is either elderly, blind, or disabled. The average allotment for AG's that contain an elderly, blind, or disabled member is at \$167. However, 22% of the EBD caseload is receiving an allotment of \$20 or less .
- **Work/Earnings:** 34% of the AG's have at least one person working. The average monthly earned income of those AG's' is \$1,160,⁴ an \$9 increase from last month. Slightly less than 37% of adult FS recipients are employed, but one tenth higher than last month. Currently, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Wisconsin is 8.9%, 3 tenths higher than last month.⁵ This is more than double the April 2008 low.




- **Working Families:** A "working family" is defined as a FS AG that contains at least one minor, at least one parent of a minor, and at least one employed recipient. This is an attempt to explore those FS recipients that have children and are working. Working families make up 26% of the statewide FS AG's, average 3.7 persons per AG, and average \$1,322 in earned income per month. Other stats are available below.



- **Allotments:** A total of \$64.1 million in food stamp benefits were issued for the month. The average allotment amount per AG is \$261



- **Statewide FS Allotments:** The graph below shows the total dollars in FS allotments spent on all FS AG's statewide for the past two years. Total issuance for this month stands at \$64.1 million. The large increase in April were due to the Federal stimulus legislation and a change in the allowed income deduction for utility expenses.
