

Who receives FoodShare Benefits in Wisconsin?

- **Poverty:** 15% of the 5.7 million people in Wisconsin receive FS.² In 2009, 12.4% of the state population was at or below the federal poverty rate.³ This is about 2% lower than the National rate.
- **Assistance Groups (AG's)/Individuals:** 414,343 Assistance groups are made up of 854,692 individuals. The AG's count decreased by 610 from the previous month. There is an average of 2.1 people in an AG.


- **Gender:** 55% of the recipients are female and 45% are male.

Adult Status and Gender



- **Adults/Minors:** 58% are adults and 43% are minors. 42% of AG's have minors in them.

- **Minors and Their Parents:** Of the AG's that contain minors, 64% have one parent in the AG, 34% have two parents, and 2% have no parents in the household. "Parent" is defined as a biological or adoptive parent.

■ Two Parent FS Family





- **Parents That Are Minors:** There are 1,046 minors in 1,032 FS AG's that are parents. A slightly lower number than last month and less than 2/10 of 1 percent of the individuals that receive FS.
- **Case Composition:** The table and graph shows other types of CARES issued assistance that a FS AG receives.




- **Historical Caseload Trend:** The statewide caseload increased slightly this month at 414 thousand, contributing to a 4.8% increase from 12 months ago.




- First Time FS AG's:** This chart shows the number of first-time FS assistance groups over the last 2 years. Only AG's that have never received FS in Wisconsin before the month shown, appear in this chart. In January, 7,797 FS AG's received FS for the first time.



- Age Distribution:** The chart below shows the number of FS recipients by age, in 5 year increments. Children, age 4 and under has the largest number for any five year grouping making up 14% of recipients. 50% of the recipients are 22 and younger.



- **Elderly/Disabled:** 19% of FS recipients are either, elderly, blind, or disabled. 36% of AG's contain at least one individual that is, either elderly, blind, or disabled. The average allotment for AG's that contain an elderly, blind, or disabled member is at \$171. However, 17% of the EBD caseload is receiving an allotment of \$20 or less.
- **Work/Earnings:** 34% of the AG's have at least one person working. The average monthly earned income of those AG's' is \$1,252,⁴ an \$8 decrease from last month. 39% of adult FS recipients are employed, slightly less than last month. Currently, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Wisconsin is at 6.6%.⁵




- **Working Families:** A "working family" is defined as a FS AG that contains at least one minor, at least one parent of a minor, and at least one employed recipient. This is an attempt to explore those FS recipients that have children and are working. Working families make up 22% of the statewide FS AG's, average 3.6 persons per AG, and average \$1,507 in earned income per month. Other stats are available below.



- Allotments:** A total of \$102.7 million in FoodShare benefits were issued for the month. The average issuance amount per AG is \$248. Below is the frequency distribution of the benefit amounts.



- Statewide FS Allotments:** The graph below shows the total dollars in FS allotments spent on all FS AG's statewide for the past two years. Total issuance for this month stands at \$97.3 million.
