

# FoodShare Wisconsin Program at a Glance



## Who receives FoodShare Benefits in Wisconsin?

- **Poverty:** 14.4% of the 5.7 million people in Wisconsin receive FS.<sup>2</sup> In 2009, 12.4% of the state population was at or below the federal poverty rate.<sup>3</sup> This is about 2% lower than the National rate.
- **Assistance Groups (AG's)/Individuals:** 402,882 Assistance groups are made up of 794,869 individuals. The AG's count decreased by 3,651 from the previous month. There is an average of 2.0 people in an AG.


- **Gender:** 55% of the recipients are female and 45% are male.

Adult Status and Gender



- **Adults/Minors:** 59% are adults and 41% are minors. 39% of AG's have minors in them.

- **Minors and Their Parents:** Of the AG's that contain minors, 66% have one parent in the AG, 32% have two parents, and 2% have no parents in the household. "Parent" is defined as a biological or adoptive parent.





- **Parents That Are Minors:** There are 900 minors in 883 FS AG's that are parents. A less than 1% decrease from last month.
- **Case Composition:** The table and graph shows other types of CARES issued assistance that a FS AG receives.




- **Historical Caseload Trend:** The statewide caseload decreased this month to 402.8 thousand, contributing to a slight decrease from 12 months ago.




- First Time FS AG's:** This chart shows the number of first-time FS assistance groups over the last 2 years. Only AG's that have never received FS in Wisconsin before the month shown, appear in this chart. In June, 4,492 FS AG's received FS for the first time.



- Age Distribution:** The chart below shows the number of FS recipients by age, in 5 year increments. Children, between ages 5-9 has the largest number for any five year grouping making up 13% of recipients. 50% of the recipients are 24 and younger.



- **Elderly/Disabled:** 22% of FS recipients are either, elderly, blind, or disabled. 41% of AG's contain at least one individual that is, either elderly, blind, or disabled. The average allotment for AG's that contain an elderly, blind, or disabled member is at \$133. However 30% of the EBD caseload is receiving an allotment of \$20 or less.
- **Work/Earnings:** 32% of the AG's have at least one person working. The average monthly earned income of those AG's' is \$1229,<sup>4</sup> a slight increase from last month. 40% of adult FS recipients are employed, a slight increase from last month. Currently, the seasonally adjusted unemployment rate in Wisconsin is at 4.6%.<sup>5</sup>




- **Working Families:** A "working family" is defined as a FS AG that contains at least one minor, at least one parent of a minor, and at least one employed recipient. This is an attempt to explore those FS recipients that have children and are working. Working families make up 20% of the statewide FS AG's, average 3.6 persons per AG, and average \$1,498 in earned income per month. Other stats are available below.



- Allotments:** A total of \$83.3 million in FoodShare benefits were issued for the month. The average issuance amount per AG is \$207. Below is the frequency distribution of the benefit amounts.



- Statewide FS Allotments:** The graph below shows the total dollars in FS allotments spent on all FS AG's statewide for the past two years. Total issuance for this month stands at \$83.3 million. The Drop in issuance in November 2013 was due to the expiration of a temporary increase in allotments granted by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 (ARRA)
