

**Attestation for Use of Standing Prescription Order
Dr. Ryan Westergaard, Chief Medical Officer and State Epidemiologist
for the Department of Health Services of the State of Wisconsin,
For trained personnel to collect and analyze COVID-19 testing samples**

This attestation form should be signed by the site’s CLIA (Clinical Laboratory Improvement Amendments) certificate of waiver Laboratory Director. Organizations are not permitted to administer point of care antigen tests without a CLIA certificate of waiver. If a CLIA certificate of waiver is held by a school district, they can submit one attestation form for the whole district.

In signing this form, I attest that I have reviewed and will comply with the following requirements to use [Dr. Westergaard’s standing order](#):

- Tests must be used on patients who meet DHS-established eligibility criteria:
 - Individuals ages 12 months and older who have symptoms suggestive of COVID-19; or
 - Individuals ages 12 months and older who have been in close contact of a person with COVID-19, regardless of symptoms; or
 - Individuals ages 12 months and older without symptoms (for example, asymptomatic screening), as part of a screening program that is done in accordance with recommendations by DHS or CDC.
- Organizations administering point of care antigen tests must ensure patients have access to confirmatory molecular/polymerase chain reaction (PCR) testing, when indicated:
 - Symptomatic patients who have negative antigen test results are recommended to have a molecular (PCR) test within 48 hours.
 - Asymptomatic people without recent contact with COVID-19 (for example, asymptomatic screening) who have a positive antigen test are recommended to have a molecular (PCR) test within 48 hours.

Please indicate one or more locations where molecular (PCR) tests are available to patients who will be tested under this order: (for example, healthcare provider, community test site, local pharmacy, at-home collection kits):

- Patients must be provided with appropriate educational materials approved by DHS. Parental consent must be obtained for patients ages 1-17 years and patients ages 14-17 must provide verbal consent themselves.
- Tests must be administered in accordance with instructions specified by the manufacturer.
- Organizations must submit all results and required patient-level data to public health agencies within 24 hours of test administration. Test results must be reported to the State of WI and to federal authorities (HHS). Reporting account set-up and guidance is available from DHS.
