

LEGAL NOTICE**Required Immunizations (shots) for Admission to Wisconsin Schools**

To the Parent, Guardian, or Legal Custodian of _____ Grade _____

The Student Immunization Law requires all students through grade 12 meet a minimum number of required immunizations prior to school entrance. These requirements can be waived only for health, religious, or personal conviction reasons. According to our records, your child is not compliant because an immunization record is not available at school, or an immunization(s) is needed (see reason for noncompliance marked below) and there is no waiver on file. To remain compliant with the law, please provide the month, day, and year your child received the required immunization(s) on the attached Student Immunization Record or select one of the waiver options prior to _____, and return the form to your child's school. Failure to do so may result in exclusion from school, court action, and/or forfeiture penalty. ¹ If your child has laboratory test results proving your child is immune to measles and mumps and rubella, or has laboratory test results proving your child is immune to hepatitis B, provide the test results to the school. If the test results are acceptable, then your child does not need to be vaccinated for the disease(s) to which he/she is already immune.

² Students who have a reliable history of varicella disease (documented in a medical chart and/or through laboratory testing) are not required to receive the Varicella vaccine. A physician, physician assistant, or advanced nurse prescriber must document a reliable history of varicella disease by indicating the student had varicella and signing the Student Immunization Form (DHS Form F-04020L).

³ If your child received a dose of a tetanus-containing vaccine, such as Td, within five years of entering the grade in which Tdap is required, your child is compliant and a dose of Tdap is not required.

⁴ One dose of Meningococcal vaccine (serogroup A, C, W, Y) is required for students entering 7th grade and a booster dose is required for students entering 12th grade. Those students who have not received their first dose by age 16 should only receive one dose.
