Rescreens and the CLTS FS

- CLTS FS determines functional eligibility initially and then once per year for multiple programs (CLTS Program, Children's Community Options Program (CCOP), Comprehensive Community Services (CCS)).
- Functional screen redeterminations for Katie Beckett Medicaid align with diary date for disability review.
- CLTS FS determines multiple levels of care and target groups for children required for program eligibility.
- All screeners screen for all programs.

What is a Rescreen?

- A rescreen/recertification/redetermination screen is required every 12 months (for CLTS and CCOP) for as long as a child is enrolled in most long-term support program.
- This is needed to verify that the child continues to meet an institutional level of care needed for long-term care program eligibility.
- Rescreens were placed on hold as of March 2020 due to the continuous enrollment requirements for Medicaid under the Families First Coronavirus Response Act (FFCRA).

Rescreens Resume

- Rescreens via the CLTS FS for CLTS and CCOP will resume June 2023, per the child's level of care (LOC) end date.
- Children with a LOC end date in June will have a rescreen completed in June and so forth.
- Katie Beckett Medicaid will also resume rescreens in June.
- You can begin to prepare for a rescreen prior to the month due.
- CCS has continued to rescreen during the public health emergency (PHE).

Level of Care (LOC) End Dates

Temporary Allowance


Extend LOC end dates by one year

FSs for CLTS Program were not completed

Routine Operations

- First LOC end dates after the end of the PHE are in June
- One FS per participant per year
- Due on level of care end date in <u>Eligibility and Enrollment</u> <u>Streamlining (EES) System</u>
- Confirm enrollment in Medicaid (MA) healthcare program




CLTS FS Rescreen Completion

All screeners are certified via the certified screener training. This means all screeners should:

- Follow the children's FS clinical instructions to complete a CLTS FS for every child
- Coordinate rescreen with CCS/CLTS county partners/Katie Beckett MA
- Verify information input if partner agency is involved
- Share eligibility results with partners agencies

Identifying Agencies Involved



Rescreen Completion

- Review individual information closely
- Update diagnosis page as needed
- List current medical providers (primary care provider (PCP) and specialists)
- Mental health
 - Time-frames
 - Behavior look back and ahead is six months
 - Suicidality look back is 12 months
 - Behavior Interventions Module 5.4

Rescreen Completion

- Instrumental activities of daily living (IADL)/activities of daily living (ADL)
 - Look back and ahead is 12 months
 - Review examples on IADL/ADL chart Module 6
 - Questions listed are a starting point
 - Request documentation early if needed
- Review school and work questions
- Maintain quality notes throughout screen
 - Keeping notes
 - Review Module 11.9

NFE for Enrollees During the PHE

- Screens for enrolled children which were found NFE (not functionally eligible) during the last three years need to be rescreened within the LOC end date month listed in EES.
- Their LOC end date has been pushed out in EES to correlate with the current year.
- If that new rescreen continues to be NFE, that screen needs peer review and confirmation of NFE by the (DHS) CLTS FS team before further action can be taken.

Quality Review of Screens

- County waiver agency (CWA) internal quality screen review of screens with a result of not functionally eligible (NFE)
- The Bureau of Children's Services (BCS) quality screen review of screens with a result of NFE
- Do not send screen results to iChange unless NFE is confirmed at BCS.
- BCS is the state agency responsible for administration of the CLTS FS.

CLTS FS Completion Methods

CLTS FS completion is not mandated to be done in person.

- If completed remotely, there must be real-time, two-way, interactive communication using both video and audio multimedia communication technology.
- If completed in person, the visit is in real-time and in same location as the participant/family.

Verifying Mental Health Diagnosis

Continuation of temporary policy must meet all the following:


- Diagnosis is made by a medical professional.
- Diagnosis is made using standardized testing and norm referenced tools.
- Participant or their legal representative and support and service coordinator believe the diagnosis is current.

For purposes of the CLTS FS, autism spectrum disorder is classified as both a developmental and mental health diagnosis and requires the medical professional diagnosis.



Supporting Medicaid Renewals – Eligibility for Full-Benefit Medicaid

Participants must meet nonfinancial and financial eligibility criteria for a full-benefit category of MA.

- Use "CLTS Waiver Enrollment Report" to identify MA effective and end dates.
- Work with participant/family on MA eligibility; may need to help with home and community-based waiver (HCBW) MA.
- Disenroll participant without any full-benefit category MA in EES.
- MA eligibility specialists refer participant to <u>Covering</u> <u>Wisconsin</u>.

7500 children are in both Katie Becket MA and CLTS Program

Fee-for-service Medicaid for children with exceptional care needs. To be enrolled, a child must meet the following eligibility criteria:

- Under 19 years old
- Disabled as defined under Social Security Administration (SSA)
- Wisconsin resident

2 of 2

- US citizen or qualifying immigrant
- Residing in an eligible community setting
- Meets LOC based on the CLTS FS
- Child income requirements

Initial Application Process

Intake

- Application process begins
- Screen visit held or scheduled

Functional Screen/ Application

- Functional screen interview
- Application and eligibility criteria reviewed

Disability Determination

 Record review to determine whether the child meets "disability" criteria of the Social Security Act

Annual Renewal Process

Financial/ Demographic

- Annually
- All Katie Beckett members


Medical Renewal w/ Current LOC

- Diary date due
- Functionally eligible screen
- Less than 1 year old

Medical Renewal LOC Needed

- Diary date due
- NFE screen
- Screen over 1 year old

- With the resumption of annual rescreening for CLTS, there may be a surge in requests for accounts and user issues.
- To avoid delays:
 - New staff should request access as early as possible.
 - Existing staff who may have not logged in recently should verify their ability to log in in advance.


Changes to New Screener Certified Training
