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Introduction

What is the screen?

- A secure online functional needs assessment with programmed logic to determine eligibility for mental health and substance use disorder programs for people ages 18 and over.
- It can also be completed for youth ages 16 and over to allow for advanced planning.

History

- The framework of the adult and children's long-term care functional screens was adopted for the Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Functional Screen in 2001.
- There have been no major content updates to the Mental Health and Substance Use Disorder Functional Screen since its inception.

- Updating risk factors section with current substance use disorder language
- Correcting and updating mental health and substance use disorder diagnosis page to reflect DSM-5-TR

Risk Factors – Substance Use

Outcomes of substance use

Outcomes of Substance Use Information

*Outcomes of Substance Use (Choose only one):

- No or low risk evident in past 12 months. Include person with a history of substance use who has been abstinent the last year.
- In past 12 months, substance use has involved risks but it is not clear that negative consequences have occurred.
- In past 12 months, person has experienced negative consequences in legal (including OWI), financial, family, relational, or health domains that are linked to substance use.

Used Alcohol or Drugs Weekly.

Spent a lot of time either getting alcohol or drugs, using alcohol or drugs, or feeling the effects of alcohol or drugs (high, sick).

Kept using alcohol or drugs even though it was causing social problems, leading to fights, or getting into trouble with other people.

Use of alcohol or drugs caused applicant to give up, reduce or have problems at important activities at work, school, home or social events.

Had withdrawal problems from alcohol or drugs like shaking hands, throwing up, having trouble sitting still or sleeping, or used any alcohol or drugs to stop being sick or avoid withdrawal problems.

Risk Factors – Substance Use

Outcomes of substance use – New

- *“No or low risk evident in past 12 months (to include persons in sustained remission – no symptoms, except for craving, for more than 12 months).”*
- *“In the past 12 months, substance use has involved risks but it is not clear that negative consequences have occurred.”*
- *“In the past 12 months, person has exhibited a problematic pattern of use leading to clinically significant impairment or distress.”*
- First drop down – *“Used alcohol or drugs weekly or more often”*

Risk Factors – Substance Use Treatment

Change “Substance Use Treatment (not detox)”

Substance Use Treatment

*Substance Use Treatment (not detox):

Check all time periods that apply.

13 months to 3 years ago

To... *“Have you received treatment, counseling, medication, case management, or aftercare for your use of alcohol or any other drug? Please do not include any emergency room visits, withdrawal management, and support group meetings.”*

Risk Factors – Substance Use Peer Group Support

Change “Substance Use Peer Group Support (e.g. aftercare group, AA, NA)”

*Substance Use Peer Group Support (e.g., aftercare group, AA, NA):

Check all time periods that apply.

Within past year

13 months to 3 years ago

To...“*Have you attended one or more support group meetings or received support from a peer specialist or recovery coach for your alcohol or other drug use? (e.g., AA, NA, Celebrate Recovery, SMART Recovery, etc.).*”

General Updates – Diagnosis Page

- Removed old ICD-9 codes
- Updated diagnoses/groupings to reflect DSM-5-TR
- Added “.x” to the end of substance use disorder ICD-10 codes to include specifiers
- Added trauma section with a new trauma diagnosis

New Diagnosis Page

Mark all active diagnoses using the most recent assessment. Diagnoses must be obtained through a health care provider or medical record.

Diagnosis Page – New Field and Removals

- New field
 - F43.8, F43.9 Other specified/unspecified trauma- and stressor-related disorder
- Removals
 - Impulse-control disorder NOS
 - No longer exists in DSM-5-TR
 - Pain disorder
 - Has never been selected by a screener so it will be removed

Summary of Manual Changes

- Made needed updates to the manual to match the soon-to-be published screen as well as any policy changes included in email blasts
- Reorganized the information into new sections, created a glossary, provided more guidance around how to screen applicants
- Updated the definition of part-time employment and full-time employment to match federal employment definitions
- Removed requirement for signed consent form
- Changed the “in-person screening” to best practice rather than a requirement

Summary of Training Updates

- Using two intensive case studies throughout the entire training rather than short case studies for each section to better embody how a screen would be completed
- Updating content to match updated manual and screen

Format and content is staying primarily the same.
