Baseline for Measurement

Kewaunee County Public Health developed and implemented a safe sleep campaign that used WIC as well as our home visitation program to first-time mothers. A questionnaire was designed to address parents knowledge of safe sleep practices. The questionnaire asked 1. Whether medical providers did teaching with new parents on where their infant should sleep; 2. Do parents sleep with their infant; and 3. Where does their infant typically sleep (crib, pack-n-play, car seat, bassinet, bouncer, on chest, in my bed). This questionnaire was used at the birth of the newborn and again three months later.

43 clients were initially screened. 91% admitted their medical provider spoke with them about safe sleep. 21% admitted to sleeping in bed with their newborn; 47% denied sleeping with their newborn. According to our questionnaire between 40-43% of the new parents screened stated their infant slept in a crib or bassinet.

When we re-assess our clients three months after the birth of their newborn and having received teaching regarding safe sleep at the health department we found 94% of parents admitted that their medical provider had spoken with them regarding where their baby should sleep, only 8% admitted to sleeping with their infant, and 64% of parents stated their infant slept in a crib.

Context

A high number of mothers in Kewaunee County co-sleep with their infants. In addition, a high number of mothers admit that their infant sleeps in places other than the crib or bassinet. In 2014, a Safe Sleep Campaign was implemented by WIC/MCH staff. A questionnaire was developed to address 1. Whether medical providers did teaching with new parents on where their infant should

sleep; 2. Do parents sleep with their infant; and 3. Where does their infant typically sleep (crib, pack-n-play, car seat, bassinet, bouncer, on chest, in my bed). This questionnaire was used at the birth of the newborn and again two months later.

Staff will continue to utilize this questionnaire to collect data on sleep practices of new parents in Kewaunee County. Parents will be educated using teaching information based off of the American Academy of Pediatrics recommendations released in 2011.

Context Continued

Input Activities

Based on the evidence based practices of the American Academy of Pediatrics and healthychildren.org:

1. The Kewaunee County Public Health Department WIC / MCH staff will continue to survey new parents at their initial visit as well as at a three month follow-up visit to assess awareness of safe sleep practices.
2. Kewaunee County Public Health WIC / MCH staff will distribute safe sleep literature, safe sleep magnets, and safe sleep wall clings to all new parents within Kewaunee County.
3. Kewaunee County Public Health staff will develop a teaching handout on the dangers of co-sleeping with your infant.
4. Kewaunee County Public Health will develop a safe-sleep information board to be displayed within the WIC/Public Health waiting room.
