Serve as fiscal agent for ASPR approved funding to provide \$10,000 for each of the 12 air support services to update existing public safety communications equipment to allow EMS services to more effectively communicate with hospitals using the WISCOM system to enhance patient care. The HPP program will work with each air support service to determine the best option to update equipment. Contract includes \$2,000 for fiscal agent fee.

WISCOM / Communications Enhancements for Air Medical

Hospital Preparedness Program Funding Program

Overview Document - January 30, 2015

Budget Period 3 (July 1, 2014 – June 30, 2015)

The Wisconsin Hospital Emergency Preparedness Program (WHEPP) has received approval to use \$120,000 in Federal Hospital Preparedness Program (HPP) funding carried over from the BP2 budget period to fund approximately \$10,000 for each of the 12 air medical helicopters based in Wisconsin to update existing public safety communications equipment. The goal is to integrate WISCOM into air operations to allow more effective communications. This will include coordination of response with on-scene personnel and hospitals to enhance patient care and crew safety.

The following steps will document that the air medical service wishes to proceed with this program, will complete the chosen option before the deadline and provide the requested information and details on project expectations as shown below.

Step 1: Please provide a Scope of Work (SOW) indicating which funding option your air medical service will pursue:

- Upgrade existing in-flight communications to include the WISCOM system
- Upgrade existing dispatch center telecommunications to be integrated with WISCOM
- Other communications upgrades – describe the project and how it would allow the air service to more effectively communicate with hospitals and other partners, including EMS, etc.

Step 2: In addition to the chosen funding option, and in working with your communications vendor, include in this SOW:

- The equipment to be purchased and the labor involved, with an estimated total cost
- The existing communications gap that is being addressed
- How this SOW will assist to solve this communications gap
- This SOW can be provided in e mail form and submitted to Paul Wittkamp at: paul.wittkamp@wisconsin.gov Call 608 261 9306 with any questions. The SOW will be approved and you will be given permission to proceed.

Step 3: Once you receive approval of your SOW, you may work with your vendors to secure the approved services and equipment. **All equipment must be ordered and the project fully installed and completed by June 30, 2015 to meet HPP grant requirements.**

Per HPP grant approval, this program is open to all rotor wing Wisconsin based air medical operations.
