### Objective: Primary Details

#### Objective Statement (Template Objective)

The Adult Immunization contract cycle will be May 1, 2016 through June 30, 2017 (14 months).

By June 30, 2017, 32% adults aged greater than or equal to 19 years residing in Marinette County will have received a dose of 2016-2017 seasonal influenza vaccine.

**Deliverable Due Date:** 07/31/2017

#### Contract Deliverable (Evidence)

A Wisconsin Immunization Registry (WIR) generated population-based standard benchmark report documenting the number of adults in Marinette County with an age-appropriate indication during the 14-month contract cycle. Reports should be run with a 45 day buffer to ensure that all updated data has been received by the Wisconsin Immunization Registry (WIR). Include a report of the accountability targets and the progress achieved including the activities and interventions conducted; include any barriers that may have been identified. A summary of progress made on the selected objective(s) will be required at project mid-point.

#### Baseline for Measurement

The 2015 end of year population based standard benchmark report will be used to determine the baseline for the current adult population based objective.

For the baseline the following parameters will be used to run the benchmark report:

Date of birth range:

greater than or equal to 19 years (Influenza): less than or equal to 7/1/1996 (use 1/1/1900-6/30/1996 in benchmark report)

Evaluation date: 6/30/2015 to assess the 2014-2015 influenza season coverage rates.

Run date: 2/15/2016

#### Context

Adults will be assessed using the benchmark report for having a dose of 2016-2017 influenza vaccine. Progress towards reaching 90% will be measured using a WIR benchmark report. Only adults who have moved out of the agency's jurisdiction may be removed from the cohort for analysis. Unless you can prove that an adult has moved out of your jurisdiction, you cannot remove them from your cohort.

Guidelines for determining increase needed for progress toward contract cycle goals:

20%-29% - 8% above baseline

30%-39% - 7% above baseline

40%-49% - 6% above baseline

50%-59% - 5% above baseline

60%-69% - 4% above baseline

70%-79% - 3% above baseline

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80%-85% - 2% above baseline

86%-89% - 1% above baseline

greater than or equal to 90% - maintain

Agencies should consult with their Regional Immunization Representative for assistance with determining activities and interventions that will help them achieve the required increase for their population assessment.

### Context Continued

Marinette County's Benchmark report was run on April 27, 2016. Using the following parameters for the adult influenza objective:

All residents residing in Marinette County

Birth Date Ranges of 1/1/1900 - 6/30/1996

Eval Date: 6/30/2015

Total Clients were 35,583

8,690 Clients (24%) met benchmark criteria for influenza vaccine.

26,893 Clients did not meet benchmark criteria during influenza season 7/1/14 - 6/30/15.

### Input Activities

Marinette County will continue to offer adult vaccination of school staff as part of our mass immunization clinics in the school settings and will have doses entered into WIR within 72 hours of administration.

We will have support staff complete WIR record clean up of individuals that have expired or moved out of our jurisdiction.

Marinette County staff will be working closely with long term healthcare providers to encourage use of the Wisconsin immunization Registry. Immunization staff will serve as a resource for questions and support. We will be requesting that adult vaccine doses administered to residents and employees are entered into the WIR. Many of our LTCF have mandatory influenza vaccination programs for their employees.

We will utilize reminder recall letters in our outlying areas to encourage vaccination at community influenza clinics.

Consider attendance at an Immunization Program-approved adult immunization conference (using up to \$500 of adult immunization grant funds) and plan for disseminating information gathered during an educational session with local health care providers (e.g., during educational sessions or coalition symposiums)
