By June 30, 2017, 39% adults aged greater than or equal to 19 years residing in Sawyer County will have received a dose of 2016-2017 seasonal influenza vaccine.

Baseline for Measurement

The baseline for measurement from the WIR Benchmark report is 32% of Sawyer County residents have received influenza vaccine. The total clients is 16,886 and 5,392 have received vaccine and 11,494 have not.

The 2015 end of year population based standard benchmark report will be used to determine the baseline for the current adult population based objective.

For the baseline the following parameters will be used to run the benchmark report:

Date of birth range:

19-26 years: 1/1/1989-12/31/1996

greater than or equal to 19 years (Tdap): less than or equal to 12/31/1996 (use 1/1/1900-12/31/1996 in benchmark report)

greater than or equal to 19 years (Influenza): less than or equal to 7/1/1996 (use 1/1/1900-6/30/1996 in benchmark report)

greater than or equal to 60 years: less than or equal to 12/31/1955 (use 1/1/1900-12/31/1955 in benchmark report)

greater than or equal to 65 years: less than or equal to 12/31/1950 (use 1/1/1900-12/31/1950 in benchmark report)

Evaluation date: 1/1/2016 (for Tdap, HPV 3, Zoster and Pneumococcal), 6/30/2015 to assess the 2014-2015 influenza season coverage rates.

Run date: 2/15/2016

Context

Adults will be assessed using the benchmark report for having a dose or doses of (insert vaccine name). Progress towards reaching 90% will be measured using a WIR benchmark report. Only adults who have moved out of the agency's jurisdiction may be removed from the cohort for analysis. Unless you can prove that an adult has moved out of your jurisdiction, you cannot remove them from your cohort.

Guidelines for determining increase needed for progress toward contract cycle goals:

20%-29% - 8% above baseline

30%-39% - 7% above baseline

40%-49% - 6% above baseline

50%-59% - 5% above baseline

60%-69% - 4% above baseline

70%-79% - 3% above baseline

80%-85% - 2% above baseline

86%-89% - 1% above baseline

greater than or equal to 90% - maintain

Agencies should consult with their Regional Immunization Representative for assistance with determining activities and interventions that will help them achieve the required increase for their population assessment.

Input Activities

Sawyer County Health Department will work on the following recommended activities for the this objective:

1.Sawyer County Health and Human Services will train additional clerical staff in WIR to updating the status of existing WIR clients in Sawyer County jurisdiction. Our WIR coordinator will print out adult Sawyer County residents in WIR age 19 to 116 years of age. Our additional support staff will review public records to assist us in identify demographics to assist us with updating WIR.

2.Updating data for deaths for 200 Sawyer County residents in WIR age 19 to 116 years of age.

3.Updating demographics of 200 Sawyer County residents in WIR age 19 to 116 years of age.

4.Sawyer County Health and Human Services will increase opportunities for adults to receive seasonal influenza vaccine through the following planned activities in Sawyer County:

5.Increase private influenza vaccination to adults (18 to 116 years of age) at WIC Clinics

6. Increase private influenza vaccination to adults (18 to 116 years of age) at Community health clinics

7. Increase private influenza vaccination to adults (18 to 116 years of age) at ADRC visits

8. Increase private influenza vaccination to adults (18 to 116 years of age) LCO College event

9. Increase private influenza vaccination to adults (18 to 116 years of age) at small business employers

10. Increase private influenza vaccination to adults (18 to 116 years of age) through collaborating with community health partners to increase local education on the importance of receiving an adult flu vaccination and documentation in the immunization register.

11. Offer private adult influenza vaccine at one local health fair
12. Partner with local Walgreens to provide adult vaccine at local events or provide free influenza to adults without insurance through Walgreens Influenza program
13. Advertise community partners influenza vaccine clinics through our media events and within in our clinic

The Wisconsin Immunization Program recommends the following activities to help ensure the success of this objective:

Coordination of immunization services with other LHDs and/or tribal health clinics.

Sharing information on the Adult Immunization Standards with local health care providers (e.g., during educational sessions or coalition symposiums)

Requesting that adult vaccine doses administered are entered into the WIR

Reminder and recall interventions (e.g., letter, phone call, home visit)

Work with local health care providers to establish standing orders for adult immunization

Use the available billing toolkit to implement a system to bill insured clients for immunization services provided

Attend an Immunization Program-approved adult immunization conference (using up to \$500 of adult immunization grant funds) and plan for disseminating information gathered during an educational session with local health care providers (e.g., during educational sessions or coalition symposiums)

Immunization information systems are confidential, population-based, computerized databases that record all immunization doses administered by participating providers to persons residing within a given geopolitical area.

At the point of clinical care, an IIS can provide consolidated immunization histories for use by a vaccination provider in determining appropriate client vaccinations.

At the population level, an IIS provides aggregate data on vaccinations for use in surveillance and program operations, and in guiding public health action with the goals of improving vaccination rates and reducing vaccine-preventable disease.
