- A. By December 31, 2023, the Regional Center for CYSHCN will implement and evaluate strategies to increase the number of children with a medical home and supported through youth health transition

  - 1. The Regional Center will provide consultation, resources and follow up services to families.
  - 2. The Regional Center will provide information and consultation to providers and community professionals serving children and youth with special health care needs and their families.
  - 3. The Regional Center will conduct trainings in community resources/supports, youth health transition, and medical home concepts for families and community partners.
  - 4. The Regional Center will connect families with other families through referrals to P2P of WI and partnering to host support parent trainings in their region.
  - 5. The Regional Center will collaborate with community partners to support the needs of children and youth with special health care needs in quality improvement programs.
  - 6. The Regional Center will strengthen opportunities for family, youth, and community member engagement.
  - 7. The Regional Centers will extend reach to underrepresented communities that are experiencing inequities.
