A. Tribal Template Objective

By September 30, 2017, xx% children residing in (insert name of tribe) jurisdiction who turn 24 months of age during the contract year will complete 4 DTaP, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 3 Hib, 3 Hepatitis B, 1 Varicella and 4 Pneumococcal Conjugate (PCV) vaccination by their second birthday.

- C. Children will be assessed using the standard benchmark report for having 4 DTaP, 3 Polio, 1 MMR, 3 Hib 3 Hepatitis B, 1 varicella and 4 Pneumococcal Conjugate (PCV) vaccination by 24 months of age. Progress towards reaching 90% will be measured using a WIR Benchmark report. Only children who have moved out of the agency's jurisdiction may be removed from the cohort for analysis. Unless you can prove that a child has moved out of your jurisdiction, you cannot remove him/her from your cohort.

Guidelines for determining increase needed for progress towards 2017 goals:

2014 Calendar Year Baseline Required Increase:

≤ 59% - 5% Above Baseline;

60-69% - 4% Above Baseline;

70-79% - 3% Above Baseline;

80-85% - 2% Above Baseline;

86-89% - 1% Above Baseline;

≥ 90 - Maintain.

A list of accountability targets, or activities that will be conducted in order to achieve the objective goal, MUST be provided by or at the time of contract negotiation. Agencies should consult the Addendum of the Immunization Program Boundary Statement or their regional Immunization Program advisor for assistance in determining activities and interventions that will help them achieve the required increase for their population assessment.

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D. The Wisconsin Immunization Program recommends the following activities to help ensure success of this objective:

- Contacting parents of infants without immunization histories
- Tracking
- Coordination of immunization services with other tribal and local health department programs
- Sharing information with area physicians
- Requesting that information is entered into the WIR.
- Reminder/recall

The Wisconsin Immunization Program requires a minimum of 3 attempts to personally contact a responsible party.

Only children who have moved out of the agency's jurisdiction may be removed from the cohort for analysis. Unless you can prove that a child has moved out of your jurisdiction you cannot remove him/her from your cohort.

Reminder/recall activity is not listed in a particular order and we suggest you use the method that is the most successful for your community:

- Letter
- Phone call
- Home visit
- Email
- Text message

Additional interventions/activities are in an addendum to the Immunization Program Boundary Statement. These are suggested interventions/activities that tribes are strongly encouraged to consider in order to achieve this objective.
