- \$930,024
- Five year grant
 - 2011-2014
- 1.0 FTE Program Coordinator
(contracted position)
- Competitive RFA to be released in late
Spring 2011

PREP Goals

- Educate youth ages 10 – 19 on teen pregnancy prevention
 - Key measures include:
 - Delay initiation of sexual activity
 - Reduce teen pregnancy
 - Reduce STI/HIV

PREP Goals

- Provide education, guidance and programming on adult preparation topics of financial literacy, educational and career advancements and healthy relationships for 15 – 19 years
 - Key measures include:
 - Reduce poverty
 - Reduce drop out rates

PREP Proposed Implementation

- Three phases
 - Targeted approach to assure youth access to reproductive health services
 - Community level innovation around adult preparation programming
 - Use evidence based practices to address teen pregnancy prevention

Additional Teen Pregnancy Prevention Efforts

- Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Committee – DPI, DCF, DHS
 - Increase statewide coordination
 - Decrease organizational duplication
 - Maximize limited resources

Additional Teen Pregnancy Prevention Efforts

- Adolescent Sexual Health Coalitions of Milwaukee (ASHCOM)
 - Increase communication and coordination among key Milwaukee community-based providers
 - United Way, Community Advocates, Milwaukee Teen Pregnancy Prevention Network, MPS, MAPPP
 - Synthesize Milwaukee sexual health program and policy developments
