








Guiding Principles

- 3) Expanding healthcare access over the lifecourse.




Strategies



Strengthening father involvement:

- Engage, partner with and fund grassroots and informal efforts in the development of a comprehensive network of fatherhood resources and supports.
- Increase relationship-building skills and self-worth for African American men and their families.
- Increase the role that dads play in the community.
- Increase access to education and employment.
- Strengthen formal and informal partnerships to address structural barriers, including racism and discrimination.




Strategies

- Increase family-sustaining jobs for low income African American men and their families.






Expanding healthcare access over the lifecourse:


