



Steering Committee Meeting #2 Summary

On Tuesday, February 9, 2016, the Steering Committee of the Wisconsin Health Improvement Planning Process (WI-HIPP) convened for the second of four meetings that will take place over the next nine months. The discussion was led by co-chairs Bill Keeton, Wisconsin Public Health Council and AIDS Resource Center of Wisconsin, and Karen McKeown, Wisconsin Department of Health Services Division of Public Health Administrator and State Health Officer.

The Steering Committee was updated on WI-HIPP's progress, which is in transition from compiling the State Health Assessment to identifying health priorities. The group received health issue fact sheets in advance of the meeting, which are part of the state health assessment. The fact sheets provide an overview of the health issues that affect many communities across the state, and were used to inform the discussion at the Steering Committee meeting. The group was encouraged to provide feedback on the fact sheets. The Committee discussed the health issues both in large and small groups as they explored priority setting. At the end of the meeting, the group recommended the Department of Health Services reach out to subject matter experts for additional data to help further guide the priority selection process.

The Communications and Engagement Workgroup solicited input from the Steering Committee on potential partners for opportunities to engage with stakeholders across the state.

The Steering Committee will convene for the third meeting in Spring 2016.
