The following subcommittees and work group have met since the September IMAC meeting:

IT

The subcommittee met on 9/25/15 and discussed the following:

- IM Priority Items and DHS Maintenance List
 - The IMAC IT members have the opportunity to review the DHS Maintenance work items and rank them in the order we feel is most important. Bonnie DeBauche will send the list out to Consortia and need a response by 10/2/2015 to send to Raquel. Once the items are ranked the list will be sent to Deloitte to provide an estimate release date.

The October 9th meeting was canceled.

CCA

The CCA Operations/Technical Subcommittee's focus has been on recent telecom issues experienced by some agencies. In an effort to better serve the agencies, the CCA Systems team reviewed their internal process for handling these events. This included prioritization and escalation of issues. The Subcommittee will continue to monitor and follow-up on these types of events.

Foster Care Medicaid Ad Hoc Work Group

- The Foster Care Medicaid Ad Hoc work group met on September 9th.

- Participants included Department of Health Services (DHS) staff and income maintenance consortia representatives.
- DHS summarized the enhancements that the Department of Children and Families is making to eWiSACWIS including:
 - Automation and enrollment, renewal and disenrollment from Foster Care Medicaid;
 - Daily batch updates from eWiSACWIS to ForwardHealth interChange; and
 - eWiSACWIS Discharge Report (to be used to support the hand off between child welfare and income maintenance agencies).
- The work group discussed streamlining the hand off process between child welfare and income maintenance agencies at discharge from out-of-home care through the Enrollment Management Central Application Processing Operation (EM CAPO) and was in favor of developing a consistent process statewide.
- Income maintenance representatives shared the current methods of communications with child welfare agencies and provided feedback on ways to improve lines of communications in the future.
 - DHS will take the feedback into consideration as we continue to develop more support for children and youth enrolled in Foster Care Medicaid.
