Approval of April 17, 2025, Meeting Minutes (Katie Sepnieski)

 Motions made to approve the minutes by Ann Kriegel and Adam Chorlton, then approved by consensus.

Policy Updates (Department of Health Services)

- The Department is closely monitoring new federal guidance as it is received. Budget negotiations and proposed legislation at the federal and state level is also being monitored.
- There are not any changes to programs or policies at this time, but any changes will be shared if received.

FoodShare

- The Department has a phase of policy updates related to the Fiscal Responsibility Act (FRA) of 2023, as the final rule was published.
- FRA required that State agencies implement certain provisions before the final rule:
 - Gradual upper age limit for the age-related Able-Bodied Adults without Dependents (ABAWD) exemption; and
 - o Three new exemptions for individuals who are homeless, a veteran, or former foster youth.
- The final rule updated the definitions of the three new exemptions and made changes to screening and verification of exemptions.
- The Department is implementing the FRA final rule in two phases. The first phase of changes will begin on July 1, 2025. No system changes will be completed until the second phase, which is planned for the February 2026 CARES release.
- Expanded definitions of the three new exemptions will be effective July 1, 2025:
 - The definition of homeless is expanded to include those who will imminently lose their nighttime residence.
 - The definition of a veteran is expanded to include an individual who served as a commissioned officer of the Public Health Service, Environmental Scientific Services Administration, or the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration, regardless of the conditions of their discharge or release.
 - The definition of former foster youth is clarified to specify that people who remain in extended foster care or those who leave extended foster care before the maximum age are still eligible for the exemption.
- The first phase will include policy requirements that will strengthen current practices.
 - If an individual reports a new exemption during the certification period, the Income Maintenance (IM) agency must act on the change as soon as possible.
 - If the IM agency determines an individual's exemption is questionable, the IM agency must first attempt to verify the exemption using information available to the IM agency, such as information from other programs through data sharing, before requiring individuals provide evidence or other sources of verification.
- The second phase will include system changes. As part of this release, system changes will be implemented to support the Phase 1 policy changes. For example, any necessary updates to interview question prompts and automated notices to capture the modified exemption criteria.

- A new FRA policy will be implemented as part of Phase 2. This new policy provides that people who
 lose an exemption during the certification period cannot be subject to countable months until are
 screened for all exemptions.
- More information will be shared regarding the second phase in advance of the February 2026 CARES release.

ABAWDs Regaining Eligibility

- At the April 2025 IMAC meeting, the Department shared the plan to send a one-time letter to
 individuals that used the third countable month in March and lost eligibility March 31, 2025. The
 purpose of this letter was to provide reminders on how to regain eligibility by either meeting the
 work requirement or an exemption.
- There was an increase in ABAWD applications in January 2025, presumably due to the three-year clock reset, and as a result, a similar number of individuals lost eligibility due to the time limit in both March and April. The Department decided to send an additional letter the week of May 5, 2025, to individuals that used their third countable month in April.
- At present, the department is anticipating sending letters to individuals that accrued the third countable month on a permanent, rolling basis.
