FoodShare

Fiscal Responsibility Act Final Rule (FRA) Phase 1 Update

- At the May 2025 IMAC meeting, the Department announced policy changes related to the FoodShare Work Requirement and exemptions that will be implemented under the Fiscal Responsibility Act Final Rule.
- Phase 1 implementation date will change from July 1, 2025, to August 1, 2025, to ensure sufficient time for finalizing our policy guidance and other implementation tasks.

Six-month Review Form (SMRF) Break in Service

- Beginning the week of June 23, 2025, FoodShare households must submit SMRFs and all required verification by the end of the month the SMRF was due in, or participants will have a time when FoodShare benefits are not received.
- More information will be available on the website soon.

Summer Electronic Benefits Transfer (EBT)

- On June 7, 2025, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services (DHS) issued more than \$51,949,000.00 in Summer EBT benefits to 239,064 families throughout Wisconsin. The benefits sent out so far will help almost 433,000 children.
- Families received \$120 for each eligible child. This is a one-time payment for each child and is equal
 to \$40 per summer month for each eligible child. The amount was determined by the United States
 Department of Agriculture.
- The Summer EBT program helps families buy food for children when school is out. To be eligible for summer EBT benefits, a child must have met one of the following requirements at any point during the 2024-2025 School Year:
 - Approved to receive free or reduced-price meals through the National School Lunch Program (NSLP).
 - School-aged children, and the household is part of FoodShare, Wisconsin Works (W-2), the Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR), or certain income-based Medicaid programs; or were known to be a migrant, in foster care, or experiencing homelessness.
 - Over the summer, the Department will continue to send Summer EBT benefits to any
 eligible children who were not identified in time for the June 7, 2025, issuance. Benefits will
 be sent to these children in a "catch-up" issuance. These issuances will happen throughout
 the summer until the end of September 2025. Eligible children will only be sent benefits
 once.
- Children of families that did not receive benefits in the initial issuance may still be able to get benefits.

- Some families with children who met the requirements to automatically receive Summer
 EBT, but did not get benefits, may need to update their contact information. These families should use the Benefit Management Tool to provide their most current information.
- Families of school-aged children who did not get benefits.
 - Children that are school-aged but did not yet get summer EBT benefits may be eligible if their families apply for one of the qualifying benefit programs during this summer. These programs include:
 - FoodShare
 - Wisconsin Works (W-2)
 - The Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations (FDPIR)
 - Certain income-based Medicaid program (See Medicaid in Wisconsin: A-Z, P-02383)
- If a family is approved for one of these programs by August 28, 2025, then the child may qualify for Summer EBT. Children who did not attend a school participating in the NSLP during the 2024-2025 school year must be school-aged. For further information on what is considered school-aged, refer to the is available on the DHS Summer EBT webpage. <u>Summer EBT | Wisconsin Department of</u> Health Services
- If a child qualifies by the deadline, DHS will issue the benefits as soon as possible once the information is received. To learn more about applying for one of the programs, families can call 211, visit the ACCESS website, or can contact their local income maintenance or Tribal agency.
- Families of children in NSLP schools can also apply directly for Summer EBT through our online application. Families must complete an application by August 28, 2025. https://dpi.wi.gov/school-nutrition/programs/SummerEBT.

Healthcare

Health Care Policy Operations Memos

- Spousal Impoverishment Mass Change
 - o The annual spousal impoverishment mass change occurred the first Saturday of June.
 - An operations memo was published June 6, 2025, with the 2025 amounts for the spousal impoverishment community spouse income allowance minimum allocation, the spousal impoverishment dependent family member income allowance standard, and the shelter base amount.
 - These amounts increased effective July 1, 2025.
 - The new limits were in CARES on June 7, 2025.
 - CARES eligibility redeterminations for July benefits occurred on June 7, as part of the mass change.

- For the June 2025 CARES release, two health care operations memos were published June 6, 2025:
 - o Updates to 12-Month Continuous Health Care Coverage for Children
 - Continuous coverage may end when their eligibility determination was made based on incorrect information or agency error and
 - A new 12-month continuous coverage period will be established when a child transitions from a CHIP-funded category of BadgerCare to Medicaid.
 - Medicaid Redetermination Compliance
 - Changes to ensure Medicaid and BadgerCare Plus members' coverage is maintained while the agency is redetermining their eligibility at renewal or due to a change in circumstances.
 - This includes maintaining coverage when
 - a renewal is received after adverse action through the end of the renewal month
 - while considering other bases of eligibility during a change
- The Department is planning to issue an operations memo in the next month regarding retirement and annuities.
 - The memo will announce changes related to:
 - The treatment of individual retirement annuities owned by an ineligible spouse, and
 - The treatment of irrevocable annuities purchased on or after March 1, 2004, that are paying out.
 - Effective July 1, 2025, IRA annuities owned by an ineligible spouse will be exempt if the
 individual that funded the IRA annuity and the annuitant are the same individual. If the
 person who funded the IRA annuity is not listed as the annuitant, the IRA annuity is a
 non-exempt asset for the ineligible spouse.
 - For long-term care cases, exempt IRA annuities owned by an ineligible community spouse are not counted for the asset assessment or the eligibility determination but are still subject to LTC annuity disclosure and remainder beneficiary designation requirements. These are not considered in divestment determinations for the LTC spouse if the long-term care remainder beneficiary designation requirements are met.
 - Effective for applications filed on or after July 1, 2025, irrevocable annuities currently
 paying out will be counted as income to the annuitant rather than available assets for
 Medicaid, regardless of when the annuity was purchased. It will no longer be a
 requirement for IM to determine whether an irrevocable annuity currently paying out
 can be sold on the secondary market to determine whether it is treated as an asset or
 income.
